





SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Porn star Llona Staller, who doubles as a member of the Italian Parliament, is awaiting final approval from the U.S. consul in Rome to allow her to fulfill a five-day engagement this

week at an adult theater.

The INS regional service center in San Ysidro, near San Diego, recently approved Staller's petition, but a ca-ble detailing the action was not expected to reach Rome until Tuesday, said Carol A. King, an attorney for the O'Farrell Theater. "There's a possibility that she can be here on (Thursday) as long as everything goes smoothly," King said.

Staller, 37, is known on stage as "Cicciolina" and won election in 1987 to Italy's Chamber of Deputies on the ticket of the tiny Radical

• Landfills are overflowing with fast-food wrappers. Not so. They amount to one-quarter of 1 percent. Newspapers take up 15 percent of the space in the nation's dumps, more than any other single item.


