

select the highest qualified students for its co-op program, because only they can pass the agency's stringent security clearance requirements.

"What we look for is the best and the brightest student we can find,' she said. "We're not looking for any particular (academic) discipline. We're looking for bright people who are of high moral character and who have an interest in working in for-eign affairs. From that, it then depends on what the qualifications of the individual are.

Sasso said requirements for the top-level security clearance are rigid, but that it's necessary because of the agency's importance to national se-

The agency's research into a student's past is, often, more extensive than the student might expect.

"A lot of people don't want to go through that kind of rigid process of obtaining a security clearance," she said. "We not only want to see your academic standing, but also your personal standing, your financial situation, your social behavior, your sexual behavior, drug usage. We either go back to age 18 or the last 15 years, depending on what your age

Yates said the agency's strict requirements for a security clearance are necessary because the CIA doesn't want to hire anyone with skeletons in their closets that could be used as blackmail if discovered.

Yates said the general feedback he receives from the students he has worked with has been positive because of the type of work the CIA assigns students.

"The feedback of the students that I have personally talked to has been excellent," he said. "They really like it. The CIA has a big coop program, and they're utilizing the co-op not only for hiring co-ops, but also to train them and to hire

Yates said students who wish to apply with the CIA through the comonths in advance. He also said the agency prefers students to start coopping as early as possible, and to

take a variety of courses. "They want to encourage students to start co-opping as early as their sophomore year," he said. "They encourage them to take more foreign languages and courses that have to

do with international studies. Yates said the CIA looks at the coop program as a long-term investment because they want to hire the student who already has been trained and who already has worked


