Department gets contract for engineering program

After obtaining a master's degree from A&M, employees will enter the Army Material Command. There they will be assigned to a "community command" to provide technical assistance in procuring materials for the Army and other armed forces.

Different commodity commands provide specific materials. The commands include the missile command, the tank-automotive command and the electronics command, he said.

None of the courses created at A&M will be aimed particularly at weapon systems procurement, Foster said. They will be typical of courses already offered at A&M.

"Whether you're studying maintainability to work on an automobile or whether you're studying it to work on a tank—it's still maintainability," he said.

The \$4.8 million contract between A&M and the Army will last five years, and 650 students are expected to graduate from the program during that period.

A&M competed with about 30 other universities to win the contract, Foster said. The program will continue after five years if the Army provides more funding, he said.

To receive their degrees, the Army engineers must fulfill the same requirements as other students.

The industrial engineering department currently has 150 students in its graduate program—75 master's candidates and 75 doctoral candidates.

A&M assists Saudi university with research, training efforts

Texas A&M is providing technical assistance to a Saudi Arabian university as part of a collaborative project between the United States and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

"Our main objective is to enhance the Saudi institution's capabilities in teaching and research," said Dwayne Suter, associate dean of A&M's College of Agriculture.

A&M, along with Purdue University, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University and North Carolina State University, has been working to improve the teaching and research facilities of King Abdulaziz University (KAU).

A consortium of U.S. universities was formed in 1986 to aid KAU's Faculty of Meteorology, Environment and Arid Land Agriculture (FMEA) in its teaching and research programs.

Suter, who is the project manager for the three-year program, said the goals of the project are:

- To assist the FMEA faculty in the advancement of meteorology, environmental sciences and arid land agriculture in the Western Providence (where KAU is located).
- To establish linkages for collaboration in education and research with leading universities in the United States.
- To design and construct a world-class controlled environment research facility to assist the FMEA faculty in its research programs.

Suter returned Jan. 26 from KAU's Agricultural Research Station in Saudi Arabia, where he oversaw the installation of equipment for research to increase the efficiency of water irrigation systems in the Western Providence.

"Saudi Arabia has an extensive underground water supply, but it is being rapidly depleted in certain regions in the Kingdom," Suter said. "I oversaw the installation of two lysimeters in which large boxes of soil are placed on weighing scales that are monitored with an electronic data acquisition system."

The lysimeter's purpose is to evaluate evapo-transpiration rates of plants that are planted in the lysimeter box, Suter said.

"Our research scientists in Texas have been leaders in the design and utilization of these weighing lysimeters," he said.

Another major aspect of the project is a Phytotron facility, in which the environment can be accurately controlled and monitored in a rigorously-sized plant growth chamber, Suter said.

"At A&M, we have a number of growth chambers dispersed throughout the campus," he said. "Phytotron provides for centralization of various environmentally-controlled growth chambers."

The program also includes placement of Saudi Arabian graduate students at various U.S. universities to provide quality faculty training, Suter said. A&M is educating Saudi graduate students in the areas of meteorology and arid land agriculture.

Suter said computerization is another facet of the Saudi Arabian project. That effort is intended to provide faculty and staff trained in computer applications in teaching, research and administrative areas, Suter said.
