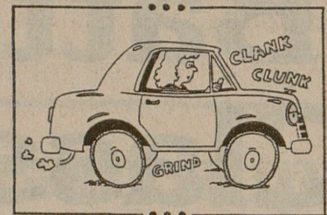

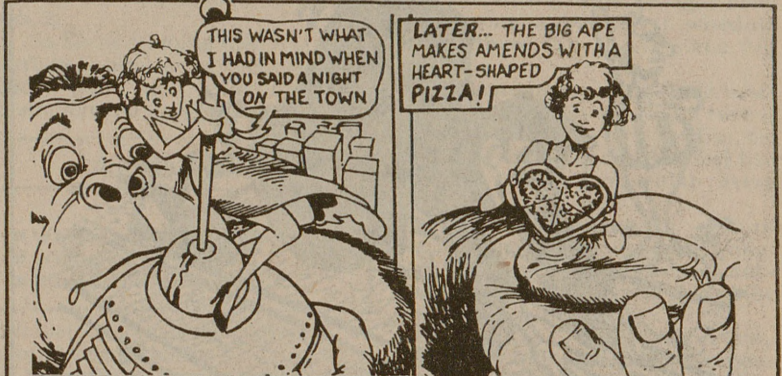

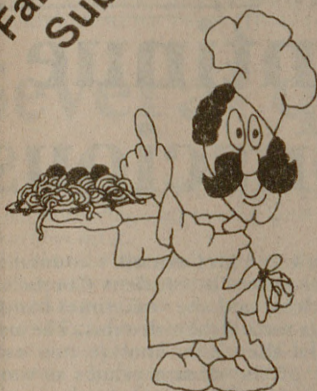

Police seek information about apartment fires

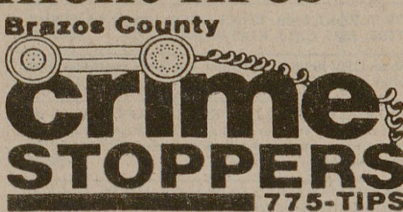
Three reports of fires in a fourplex apartment complex in the 1100 block of Groesbeck Street in Bryan have been reported in the past eight weeks.

In each case, the suspects entered vacant apartments after dark, doused them with fuel, and attempted to ignite the fuel.

The first arson attempt failed because the fuel did not ignite. The second and third attempts were successful.

Witnesses of the third attempt reported seeing two black teen-age males fleeing the scene.

Houston woman 'appalled' when 8-year-old buys condom

HOUSTON (AP) — A Houston woman says she is appalled that a local convenience store that displays "Rubber Ducky Condoms" on the same revolving rack as crayons and jacks sold the prophylactic to her young nephew.

Clare Orear said her outrage stemmed from the idea that young children might be adversely influenced by their access to the condoms.

"It's just not right," she said Wednesday. "I believe children deserve to know the facts of life before they can pluck condoms off a toy rack."

"There's a place for everything.

There's a big difference between encouraging safe sex and encouraging early sex," she said.

Mrs. Orear said the Stop N Go store displayed the colorfully wrapped condoms "as if they were some neat new toy." She added that her 8-year-old nephew walked into the store and bought the condoms, thinking they were a toy.

"I was appalled," she said. A.J. Gallerano, National Convenience Stores vice president, declined to comment on the sale of the condoms to children at Stop N Go stores.

Gallerano did, however, say Stop N Go stores would not sanction the sale of condoms to children.
