## Episcopalians consecrate female bishop in Boston

### Appointment breaks 2,000-year-old tradition

BOSTON (AP) — The barriers of two milleniums of an all-male hierarchy have been broken, and to the women who paved the way for Barbara Harris to become an Episcopal bishop, her elevation seems like a miracle.

"I feel very, very happy," said the Rev. Florence Tim-Oi Li, 81, the first clergywoman in the worldwide Anglican communion. "In my life, I can see the first woman bishop. It made me hopeful. Things are realized now."

Li stopped functioning as a priest in 1946 in response to pressure from Anglican bishops outside of China, where she was ordained in 1944, but on Saturday she and other pioneer clergywomen helped consecrate Harris.

The ceremony made Harris the first woman bishop in a church that believes in apostolic succession — that the church leadership can be traced to the apostles.

"I think it's really helped a lot of us see how history is made," said the Rev. I. Carter Heyward, one of 11 women "illegally" ordained in a service in Philadelphia in 1974 that paved the way for the Episcopal Church's approval of women clergy two years later.

While nearly all of the more than 8,000 people who packed the convention center shouted their approval, others fought right up to the end to preserve the tradi-

tion, dating back to Jesus Christ, of all-male bishops.

At the point in the ceremony when objections were called for, John Jamieson, representing a group of conservative Episcopalians called the Prayer Book Society said her "pretended consecration" holds church law "in contempt."

The Rev. James Hopkinson Cupit Jr. of New York City said the election of a woman was "contrary to the unbroken tradition of 2,000 years of apostolic order." He said it may represent an "intractable impediment" to relations with other churches that believe in apostolic succession, such as the Roman Catholic Church and Eastern Orthodoxy.

The election of the 58-year-old Harris as suffragan or assistant, bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts in September has been the most controversial in recent years. She is the only woman in the 200-member House of Bishops.

In addition to being the first woman bishop, Harris thought to be the first bishop elected after a divorce, and the first U.S. bishop, at least in modern times, to lack both a seminary degree and an undergraduate college degree.

## Eastern pulls magazine after article criticizing chairman

MIAMI (AP) — When Eastern Airlines flight attendants pass out magazines on the carrier's flights during the next few weeks, they won't be handing out the new edition of Fortune.

The airline has ordered the magazines removed from its fleet of more than 200 aircraft because the issue, which comes out at the end of this month, contains an article highly critical of Frank Lorenzo, chairman of Eastern and its Houston-based parent company, Texas Air Corp.

In a brief directive to aircraft service managers around the country,

the company said: "It's imperative that the current issue of Fortune magazine be removed immediately from all Eastern aircraft."

"Dispose of all copies locally," the directive said. "Have a member of management audit all aircraft to ensure compliance. Report accomplishment by tail number to Miami."

Lorenzo's picture appears on the issue's front cover.

The article, early on, calls Lorenzo a "loose cannon." It quotes past and present executives of Texas Air as saying that Lorenzo is a highly impulsive manager. The story talks

## West German leaders, Secretary Baker begin critical weapons talks

BONN, West Germany (AP) — Secretary of State James A. Baker III opened critical talks Sunday with West German leaders who have balked at a NATO plan to upgrade short-range nuclear missiles in Europe.

Baker flew in from London after sessions with British leaders and immediately met with Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Genscher, a strong advocate of reducing nuclear tensions in Europe.

Baker, on a six-day trip to visit the 15 U.S. NATO allies, told reporters during the flight he was not worried about West German Chancellor Helmut Kohl's statement last week that the Lance missiles now deployed are adequate until 1995.

Under the proposal before the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, the current 70-mile range would be extended with new rockets that could hit targets about 320 miles away.

"I think what we need to do is to find out exactly what the German government's position is going to be," Baker told reporters.

Eastern spokesman Robin Mac said the airline, which faces a March 4 strike threat by the International Association of Machinists, had nothing to gain by leaving the magazine on the Eastern planes.

"The profile of (Texas Air) chairman was unflattering and would be viewed in that vein by our passengers," Matell told the Miami Herald. "Considering the current environment, we decided to remove the issue."

Tower appeared headed for easy confirmation until conservative lobbyist Paul Weyrich testified before the Senate Armed Services Committee on Jan. 11 that he had seen the nominee intoxicated and accompanied by women other than his wife.

Since then, allegations have mushroomed. A confirmation vote was delayed until at least Feb. 21 by a new allegation last week concerning Tower's campaign finances during his 24-year career in the Senate.

The chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, Sam Nunn, D-Ga., has said that he could not vote in favor of Tower until the allegations are cleared up. Nunn also expressed concern over Tower's drinking.

No date has been set for the committee to vote on the nomination.

"The Senate is in the process of doing about the same thing we did before the name went up," Sununu said on the ABC-TV interview program. "This week with David Brinkley."

"I don't think that's fair to Sununu," said Sununu, in response to a question. "I think the senator's track record proves that he cares about the defense of the country."

## Parents, lesbian fight to care for brain-damaged woman

NASHWAUK, Minn. (AP) — When Donald Kowalski retired from the backbreaking life of a miner from Minnesota's Iron Range, he looked forward to years of peace and leisure.

Instead, the 58-year-old Kowalski and his wife, Della, are spending their golden years at war with a lesbian professor over who should care for their severely brain-damaged daughter, Sharon.

The professor, Karen Thompson, says she deserves to be Ms. Kowalski's caretaker because the two secretly considered themselves married before Ms. Kowalski was paralyzed in a 1983 automobile crash caused by a drunken driver.

Mr. Kowalski and his wife say the claim is bogus. They insist Thompson's interest in their daughter centers on money Thompson has generated by publicizing the case in speeches across the country and a book.

Thompson says the money is intended to help Ms. Kowalski, and she questions her parents' motives.

"They would rather see a vegetable than a lesbian," she said. "Until Sharon's rights are protected, I will fight this."

Thompson, who has become a national spokesman for gay and lesbian

rights, has helped establish two funds for her friend and organized rallies in 21 U.S. cities in August to observe "Free Sharon Kowalski Day."

According to court records, the two women had lived together for four years. Ms. Kowalski, 32, who was a high school physical education teacher, had named Thompson, 41, as the beneficiary of her \$50,000 life insurance policy before the accident.

The courts have acknowledged the relationship but have kept Mr. Kowalski as his daughter's guardian, giving him power to make decisions for her and initially allowing him to deny Thompson visiting privileges.

But in December, a judge ordered a re-evaluation of Ms. Kowalski to determine how soundly she thinks and whether she is capable of making decisions about her own care.

Ms. Kowalski, who is in a nursing home near Nashwauck, has lost the use of her limbs and is unable to speak but can use the fingers of her right hand and communicates by typing, shaking her head and using an alphabet board.

Under the judge's new order, anyone is allowed to see her if she "reliably requested" to see them.
