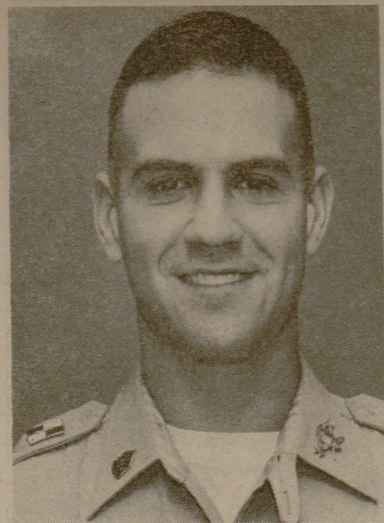


## Senior Yell Leader

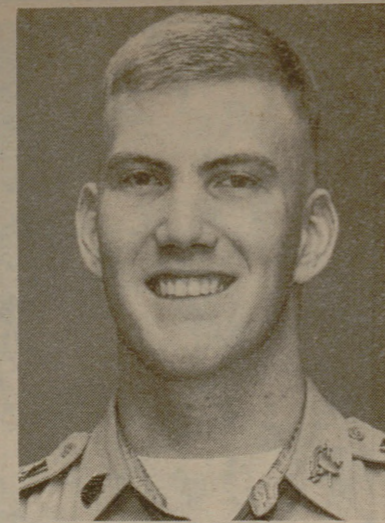


**Steve Coan**

Gig 'em!

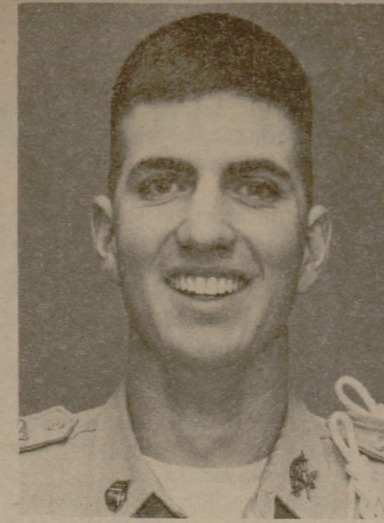


**Pat Kiely**

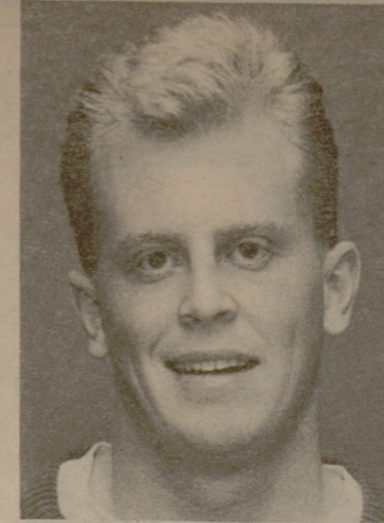

Building Construction

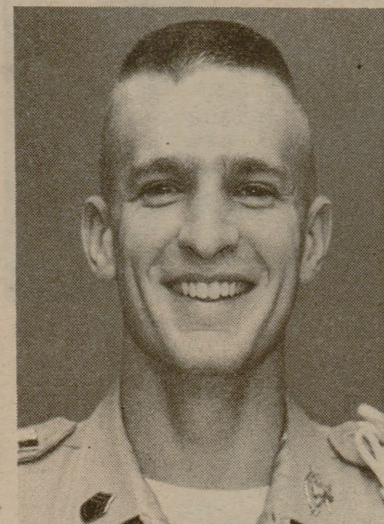

Remember, on March 30 check number three on the ballot and Be Led by Ed. Gig 'em!



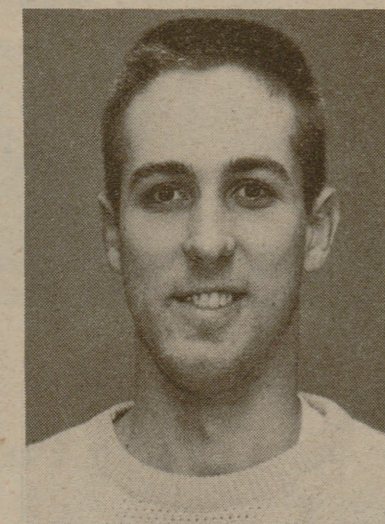
**Troy Greaves**

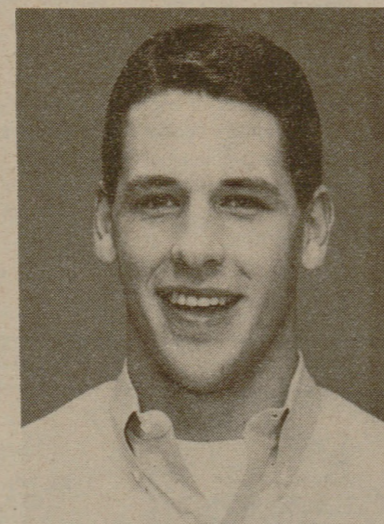
**Waylan Cain**

History

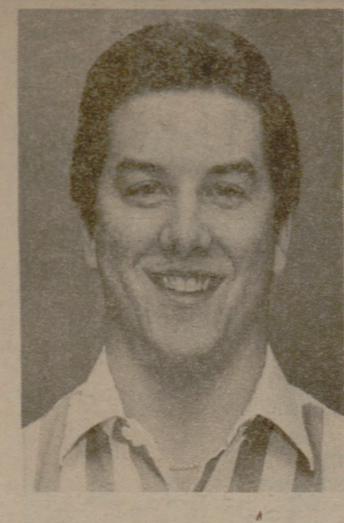

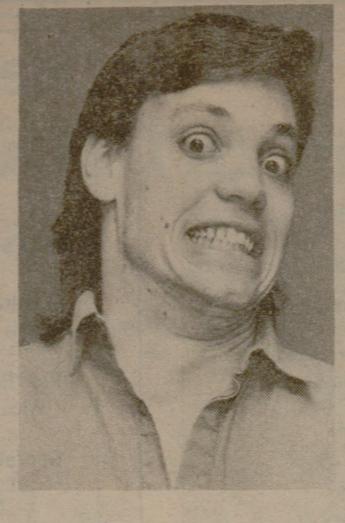
## Junior Yell Leader

Agricultural Economics

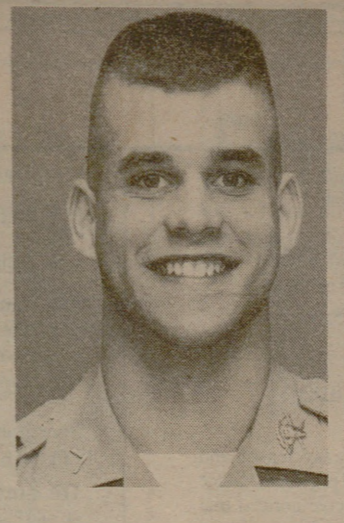
After a week of campaigners at your door, it's time for elections. I encourage Aggies to vote tomorrow.

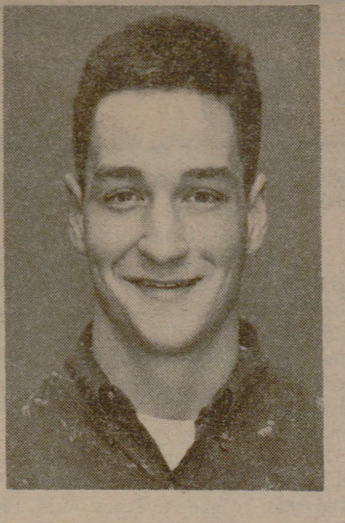


**Brant Ince**

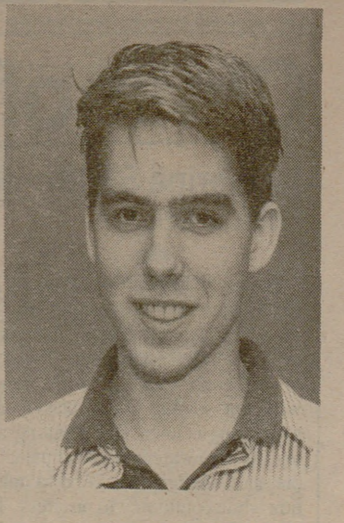


**Mike Bradley**

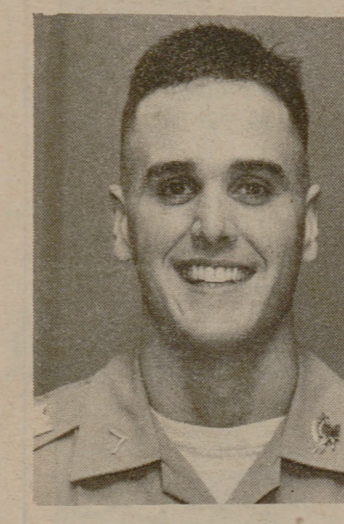

- There has only been five non-reg yell leaders, and ERIC wants to make it six.

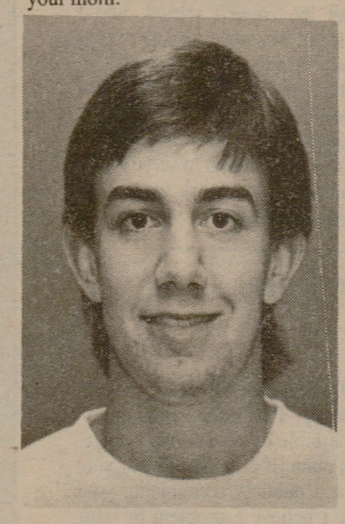


**Kevin B. Fitzgerald**

Howdy Ags, my name is Kevin Fitzgerald and I am a Company E-1 sophomore in the spirited Aggie Corps. I am from San Antonio.

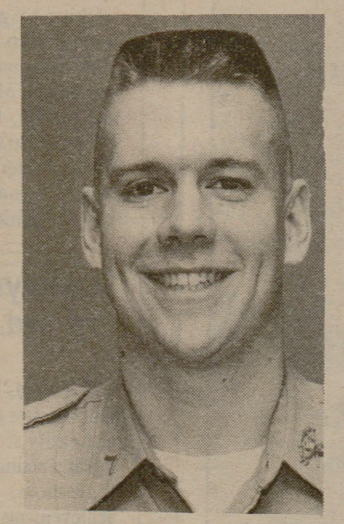

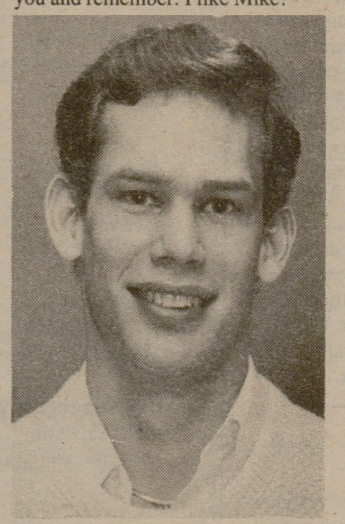
**Steven Wise**
