# Anti-abortion group blasts Mattox for abusing office

AUSTIN (AP) — The state's leading anti-abortion group Tuesday blasted Texas Attorney General Jim Mattox for joining a legal brief in support of the landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion.

"It seems to us this is just another example of Attorney General Mattox using his office, in the most blatant way, to feather his own political nest," Bill Price, president of Texans United for Life, said.

State Rep. John Smithee, R-Amarillo, also criticized Mattox, and said he would file a bill to restrict the attorney general's office in matters before the high court.

"Our attorney general has very broad and unlimited discretion," Smithee said.

But pro-choice groups immediately defended Mattox for joining a legal brief by Massachusetts and six other states supporting the 1973 Roe vs. Wade decision before the Supreme Court. The court is considering a Missouri case that could reverse, or alter a woman's right to an abortion.

The Texas Abortion Rights Action League issued a news release signed by more than 60 political and religious groups in support of Mattox's action.

"Most Texans feel that abortion is a private matter for women and their families and should be free from government interference."

"There's simply nothing controversial about the state attorney general concurring in support of the law of the land," the news release said.

Price said Mattox, who is considering running for governor in 1990, agreed to the legal brief "to curry favor with the radical special-interest groups that dictate the outcome of Democratic primary elections."

He said "Massachusetts Mattox" should consider running for governor there and later hand-delivered to Mattox's office a candidate application form for governor of Massachusetts.

Since Michael Dukakis is not seeking re-election, the field is wide open," Price said.

Ron Dusek, a spokesman for Mattox, said the attorney general joined in support of Roe vs. Wade because

"this has to do with the people's right to privacy."

Dusek tagged the "radical" label to Price. "These people are more radical than anyone, running around burning clinics and protesting in front of clinics," he said.

"Mattox takes a stand on issues," Dusek said. "He has never been accused of sitting on the fence."

But Price said Mattox has no business speaking for Texas on such a controversial matter. Producing a letter by Gov. Bill Clements, Price said the majority of Texans oppose abortions.

In that March 31 letter, Clements said he supported "the right to life position as do a vast majority of Texans."

"Quite clearly, the people of our great state want the abortion issue decided by the Texas Legislature," Clements said.
