

Likewise, housing costs were cheaper at Prairie View, she said. Average cost for room and board at Prairie View was \$2,828 and was \$3,556 at A&M. Adams also said Prairie View ranked much closer to the University of Texas than Texas A&M in costs for tuition, fees and room and board.

While there is no modelistic black or white university, Adams said, predominantly black universities are more sensitive to student's needs and make them feel more at home.

"You can't make a blanket statement that 'black' universities are better than 'white' universities," she said. "Prairie View can offer black students different things than Texas A&M can.

"It can offer blacks a setting where they're the majority, which is important for many people's self confidence. When you believe the institution represents your interests, you feel more comfortable. That's not to say A&M isn't representing black student's interest; it's just the perception you get.

"Prairie View also can offer smaller classes in most cases, and we don't use teaching assistants to the same degree that A&M does. So there's a more personalized relationship with the faculty."

Adams said one problem colleges across the nation are facing with

black enrollment is that more black females are attending and completing school than are black males.

Females constitute 52 percent of Prairie View's enrollment for this school year, and Adams said this is a dangerous trend.

"With positions in higher education, black women have held steady," she said. "In 1976, women were at 5.1 percent, and in 1986 they were at 5.2 percent. Meanwhile, black men in higher education positions dropped from 4.3 percent in 1976 to 3.5 percent in 1986.

"Black males are disproportionately at risk. Public elementary and secondary institutions tend to have low expectations of black males, and react to their behavior in a disproportionately punitive way. Studies show that black males tend to receive lower grades and less academic support than black females or whites."

Adams said Prairie View is not competing with A&M to recruit more minorities because the choice of school depends mostly on the student.

"Some black students would feel much more comfortable attending A&M and being able to be just one more student out of the 30,000," she said. "We're here to offer an alternative to that despite what ethnic origin the person is."




