Likewise, housing costs were cheaper at Prairie View, she said. Average cost for room and board at Prairie View was \$2,828 and was \$3,556 at A&M. Adams also said Prairie View ranked much closer to the University of Texas than Texas A&M in costs for tuition, fees and room and board.

While there is no modelistic black or white university, Adams said, predominantly black universities are more sensitive to student's needs and make them feel more at home.

'You can't make a blanket statement that 'black' universities are better than 'white' universities," she said. "Prairie View can offer black secondary institutions tend to have students different things than Texas "It can offer blacks a setting






