the south end of Corpus Christi Beach.

But the proposed project has been beset by a succession of problems.

Support and criticism began on a small scale with the first proposed site on Padre Island and later Fort Aransas. The battle then shifted to a much-criticized proposed setting on the Peoples Street T-Head; then to the proposed location on an ill-fated, landmass scheme in Corpus Christi Marina; and finally to its present site on Corpus Christi Beach.

Even the final choice of a future home on the beach generated controversy before the matter finally was resolved in court in a settlement between the city and Helen Royal, who owned a home and motel near the aquarium site on Corpus Christi Beach.

With an estimated 600,000 visitors expected to flock to the Texas State Aquarium annually, its economic impact to the area is expected to be more than \$25 million a year, based on anticipated sales-tax revenue, said Rob Earley, president of the Corpus Christi Area Convention & Visitors Bureau.

Construction on the first of four phases — the Jesse H. and Mary Gibbs Jones Gulf of Mexico Exhibit Building — is under way, with all but \$6.2 million of the \$31.5 million cost in hand, said Quenton Dokken, president of the Texas State Aquarium Association.

Fund-raising efforts are continuing statewide to raise the \$6.2 million, preferably by September or October, Dokken said.

Expansion of the project also was made possible with support from the city of Corpus Christi and private donors around the state. Private sector contributions total more than \$10.6 million, and the city has invested \$14.5 million in the project.

Dokken said other increases in the projected cost are associated with the higher costs of the infrastructure and property needed for the site.

In the original plans, the city was to provide a site on the Peoples Street T-head at no cost to the aquarium association. However, public and private concern over locating such a facility on the aging T-head, which some said would not support the structure, surfaced, and aquarium officials began seeking alternate sites.

One was a plan unveiled in 1983 by Bayfront Associates to develop an eight-acre commercial landmark north of the Peoples Street T-Head. Four acres were earmarked for a 25,000-square-foot, \$5 million aquarium.

However, much public clamor, both pro and con, developed during the next 2 1/2 years over the proposed new landmass. So in February 1986, the aquarium association withdrew from the landmass project and selected a site on the south end of Corpus Christi Beach.

The selection of the current six-acre site added an additional \$3 million to the cost projection for the aquarium, principally for higher infrastructure and land costs. The Peoples Street site was owned by the city while the association had to purchase the beach site.

night with her sister, Brenda Smith.

Smith and her husband, Richard, arrived at the Duncanville Police Department shortly after 1 a.m. Sunday to ask for a police escort to Wise's house.

The couple went to pick up the Wise's 13-year-old son and a friend because they feared for the boys' safety. They told police that Wise was drunk and angry.

Repp and his partner, Stacy Holden, met the Smiths at Wise's residence.

Shortly afterward, Wise arrived in plain clothes, angry and cursing, Crawford said.

Wise brandished his service pistol.

Repp, who knew Wise on a first-name basis, pleaded with the sergeant to drop the gun, but, according to witnesses, Wise taunted Repp to shoot.

Repp fired as Wise stood in front of his home and pointed at the officer.

Crawford said he believes Repp fired the first shot, in self-defense.

Capt. Don Whitten of the Dallas Police Department, which is conducting its own investigation, agreed.

"We have nothing to dispute that," Whitten said. "Repp has told the Duncanville investigators that he fired the first shot just before Wise's gun went off."

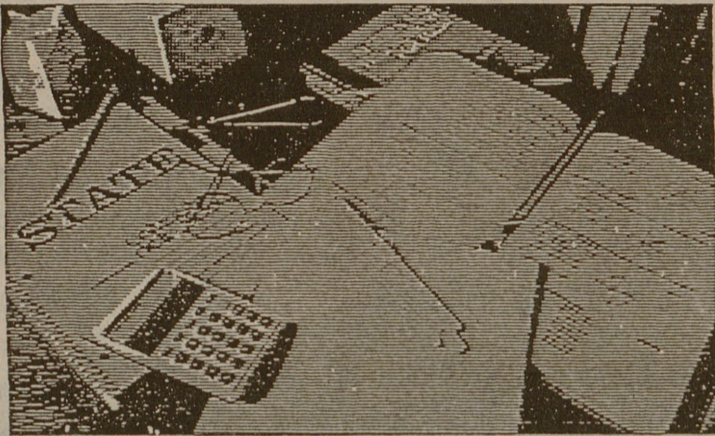
The bullet fired by Wise lodged in a bicycle, Whitten said, indicating the shot may have been fired toward the ground, as if Wise already had been hit by the time he fired.

"We don't have all the written reports yet, but as far as preliminary findings, it appears Repp did shoot first," Whitten said. The Dallas County Medical Examiner determined that Wise was legally intoxicated, with a 0.12 blood alcohol content, at the time of his death.

Colleagues of Wise said he had been depressed over the deaths of three officers he supervised. All were killed in the past nine months.
