



Fund-raising efforts are contin ing statewide to raise the \$6.2 m lion, preferably by September or 0. tober. Dokken said.

Expansion of the project also wa made possible with support from the city of Corpus Christi and private donors around the state. Private se tor contributions total more th \$10.6 million, and the city has in vested \$14.5 million in the project


Dokken said other increases int projected cost are associated with the higher costs of the infrastructure and property needed for the site. In the original plans, the city w

to provide a site on the Peop Street T-head at no cost to the aqu ium association. However, pub and private concern over locati such a facility on the aging T-heat which some said would not suppo the structure, surfaced, and aqua ium officials began seeking altern sites.

One was a plan unveiled in 19 by Bayfront Associates to develop eight-acre commercial landma north of the Peoples Street T-Heat Four acres were earmarked for 25,000-square-foot, \$5 milli aquarium.

However, much public clanz, both pro and con, developed duin the next 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> years over the pro posed new landmass. So in Febru 1986, the aquarium association wi drew from the landmass project selected a site on the south end
