Local MDA chapter sponsors typing contest

The local chapter of the Muscular Dystrophy Association will sponsor its fourth annual "Flash-type" contest Tuesday in conjunction with Secretaries' Week.

Harold Dean, supporter of the MDA and the event's sponsor, said anyone may enter the contest, which will benefit the MDA's research and patient service programs.

"There is a \$5 entry fee for the contest," Dean said. "When they sign up, they'll get an information packet and a 'Flash-type' mug. The deadline to sign up is April 25 at 10 a.m. when the contest begins."

Dean said the contest will be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the College Station Hilton's Pecan Room.

The first-, second- and third-fastest typists will be given plaques, he said. The person who raises the most money for MDA will win a trip to Irving with hotel accommodations and tickets to Six Flags.

Dean said contestants' bosses or friends may sponsor them, or typists may sponsor themselves.

"The way it usually works is a secretary will get her boss to sponsor her," he said. "They can pledge so much money per word per minute typed, but normally a set amount is pledged for donation. Someone could just raise money and not take the typing test, but we encourage them to take the test."

Dean said typists will be timed individually.

"Contestants will type a three paragraph letter," he said. "Mistakes will take away from the score."

He said 10 typists have entered thus far, but he expects the number to double. Last year five contestants participated and about \$600 was raised.

"We're hoping to generate more publicity this year," Dean said. "Anyone who is interested can call 260-9194 or come by my office and sign up."
