

= for unscrupulous lawyers

AUSTIN (AP) — The Texas Senate approved a bill Thursday that would stiffen penalties against attorneys who try to solicit business in an unscrupulous manner during a crisis

Sen. Hector Uribe said his bill was a response to complaints about attorneys after the July 7 roof collapse of

a three-story department store in Brownsville that killed 14 people and injured 47 others. The collapse occurred under the weight of rainfall trapped on the roof.

Uribe, D-Brownsville, said lawyers descended on the families of victims like "a horde of locusts.

Some attorneys or their "runners" impersonated priests and Red Cross officials to try and drum up business, Uribe said.

"These lawyers exploited this very tragic event," he said. "Lawyers should not take advantage of individuals at a time when they are

grieving or injured."

The bill would increase penalties against attorneys or their representatives who try to solicit business at a hospital, funeral parlor, cemetery or accident scene, or impersonate a clergyman, emergency worker or public employee.

House OKs bill to let doctors test patients for AIDS

AUSTIN (AP) — The Texas House on Thursday tentatively approved a bill that would allow doctors and hospitals to administer AIDS tests without specific consent

The bill by Rep. Billy Clemons, D-Pollok, would modify 1987 legislation requiring special consent for AIDS testing.

Under Clemons' bill, patients

could be asked to sign a specific con-sent form for AIDS testing or they could be tested by signing a general consent form for medical tests, which would not specify AIDS test-

After lengthy debate and a defeated motion to table the measure, House members passed it in a nonrecord vote. Another vote is required for final passage.

Restaurant Report

The restaurants listed below were inspected by the Brazos County Health Department Mon-day through Wednesday. Infor-mation is taken from a food service establishment inspection report. SCORED BETWEEN 95 AND

TCBY at 404 University Dr. as inspected by David

Plett.Score — 99. One point was deducted because hair restraint weren't used by employees with long hair.
Archie's Hamburgers at

Harvey Road was inspected by David Plett. Score — 99. On point was deducted because the ice scoop handle was in ice.

Pie Are Square at Texas A&M

was inspected by David Plett Score — 96. Four points were de ducted because handsinks didn't have hot and cold water faucet turned on.

David Jefferson, a registered sanitarian at the department, says restaurants with scores of 95 or above generally have excellent operations and facilities. He says restaurants with scores in the 70s or low 80s usually have serious violations in the health report.

Scores can be misleading, Jefferson says, because restaurants can get the same score by having several minor violations or a few majo violations. He says the minor violations can be corrected during the inspection. Point deductions or violations in the report range from one point (minor violations) to five points (major violations).

Jefferson says the department might close a restaurant if: the score is below 60, the personnel have infectious diseases, the restaurant lacks adequate refrigeration, there is a sewage backup in the building or the restaurant has a complete lack of sanitization for the

The department inspects each restaurant every six months. Jefferson says a follow-up inspection is sometimes required if a restaurant has a four- or five-point violation that cannot be corrected during the inspection, or if there are numerous small violations. Inspectors at the department are registered samtarians.
