CALL-BACK AUDITIONS will be on the Sunday following General Auditions. Please be prepared to attend, if selected.

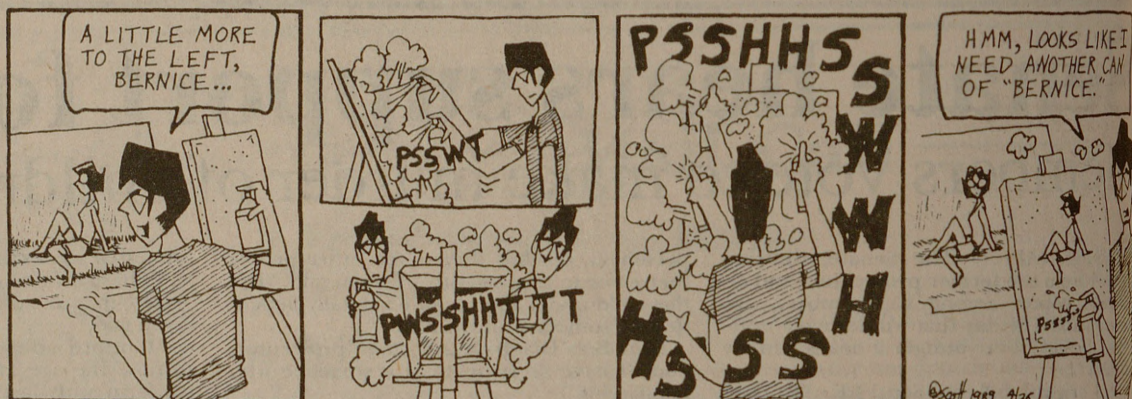

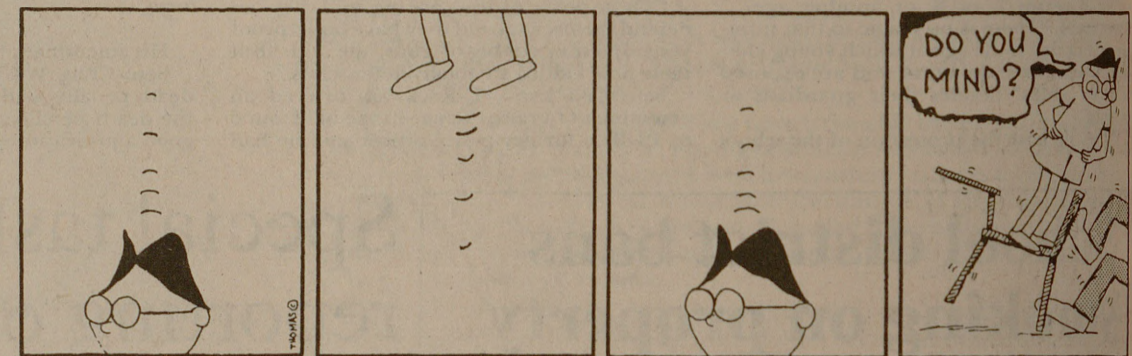

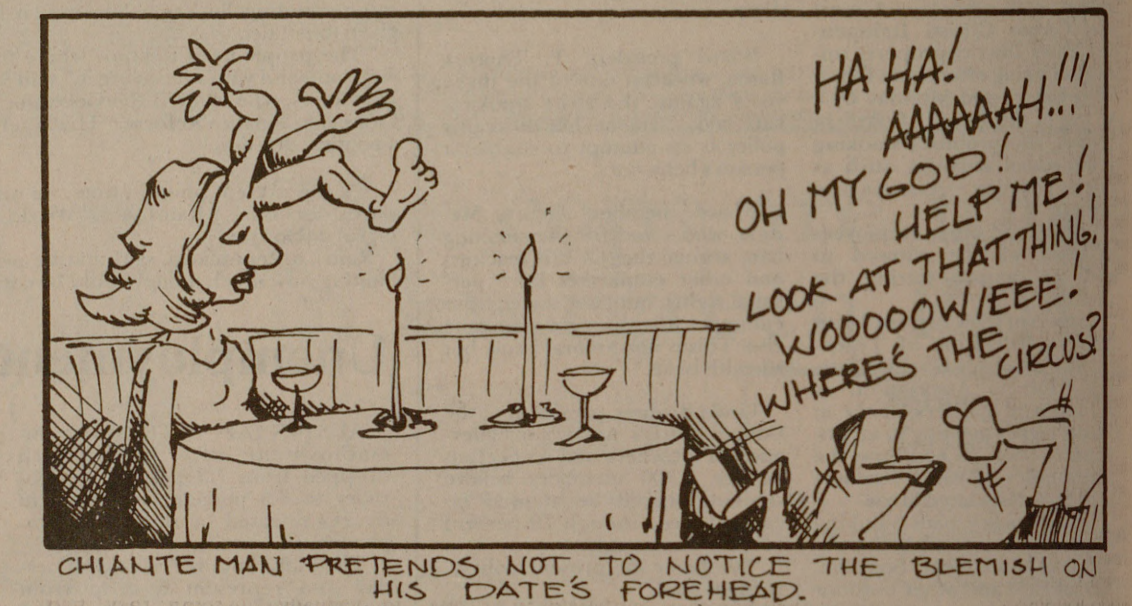
Waldo

Preacher, 40 homeless picket state Capitol for law changes

AUSTIN (AP)—About 40 homeless men, led by Fort Worth preacher W.N. Otwell, picketed the Capitol Tuesday, urging state legislators to change laws they say thwart churches and other groups trying to help the needy.

Otwell and another preacher, Aubrey Vaughan of Houston, also said lawmakers have ignored the needs of the homeless during this legislative session.

"We came down to let the state of Texas know that we're standing for the homeless," Otwell, who has been at odds with the state over licensing of a home for children, said. He now is fighting the city of Fort Worth over a permit required for dinners he serves the homeless.

City officials say the permit is required to establish the safety of food being served. Otwell has refused to work out a compromise, they said. Otwell called the city and state health requirement "ridiculous." He said lawmakers should change such regulations, which he says make it more difficult for churches and other groups help the needy.

"Every year, the lawmakers come to Austin and all they seem to do is pass more laws . . . raising taxes, raising license plates (fees), raising inspection stickers (fees). They're not helping anybody," Otwell said.

Several bills aimed at helping the homeless are being considered by the Legislature. Most of the measures are pending in committees or subcommittees.

Sen. Hugh Parmer, D-Fort Worth, and Rep. Fred Blair, D-Dallas, co-sponsored a Homeless Relief Act that would create an agency to address homeless needs. It would include programs for interim housing, health services, literacy training, job-

training, family counseling, and credit counseling.

A revised form of Parmer's bill was passed out of committee to the full Senate. Blair's bill awaits a committee hearing.

An omnibus bill by Parmer and Rep. Juan Hinojosa, D-McAllen, would establish a housing trust fund under the Texas Housing Agency to help low- and moderate-income people buy, rent or renovate affordable housing.

A bill by Sen. John Whitmire, D-Houston, and Rep. Harold Dutton, D-Houston, would allow county commissioners courts to set up commissions on the homeless.

Rep. Lena Guerrero, D-Austin, and Sen. Chet Edwards, D-Duncanville, co-sponsored legislation that would provide a property tax exemption for public housing used as temporary shelters for the needy.
