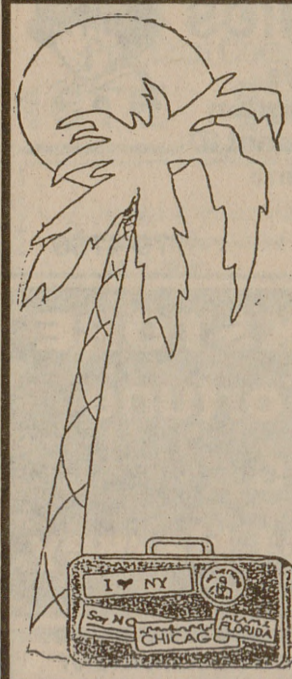

May Day revellers observe labor day with parades, riots

Warsaw's main events were peaceful, at least one clash took place late when about 100 young demonstrators marched and threw rocks at police.

Poles shouted "Down with communism!" in a May Day march through Warsaw, Soviet Armenians defied a ban on demonstrations, and rallies burst into riots in Czechoslovakia and South Korea on Monday as workers marked their worldwide holiday.

Clashes in Turkey left 36 people injured, including one man who was shot in the head; riot squads fired tear gas when leftists tried to march on the U.S. Embassy in the Philippines; and 300 radicals donned masks and looted stores in West Germany.

The Soviet Union held a traditional parade through Red Square, China used the occasion to try to ease a burgeoning student uprising, and a man holding a poster of Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev was dragged away by police in Czechoslovakia.

Around the world, thousands gathered on the international labor day to celebrate their gains with banners and balloons, or protest their losses with rocks hurled at smashed windows.

Up to 100,000 Solidarity supporters marched through Warsaw, the union's first legal May Day gathering since it was suppressed eight years ago. Nearby, about 20,000 attended the official celebration. Although

Assassinated officer buried Monday

WASHINGTON (AP) — Col. James N. Rowe, a decorated hero of the Vietnam war who was gunned down in the Philippines by communist rebels last week, was buried under a leaden sky Monday on a hillside in Arlington National Cemetery.

A caisson bearing the remains of Rowe, 51, was escorted to a gravesite in a grove of flowering cherry trees, past their peak of bloom, after private funeral services at Ft. Myer Memorial Chapel.

Secretary of Defense Richard B. Cheney and Secretary of States James A. Baker III attended the service at the chapel, which seats 800, but they did not join the estimated 450 mourners at the graveside ceremony.

Rowe was killed in a Manila suburb on April 21 as he was driving to work at the Joint U.S. Military Advisory Group Headquarters, which provides training and logistical support to the Philippine military. His assailants sped away.

The communist New People's Army General Command claimed responsibility for the assassination and threatened further attacks if the United States continues to back President Corazon Aquino's fight against a communist insurgency.

Cheney, in a statement after the shooting, called Rowe "a true hero whose military career exemplified dedication to his country and to freedom."

Rowe had continued to serve his country even after being held prisoner during the Vietnam War.

House OKs collider construction date

WASHINGTON (AP) — House Budget Committee negotiators finalized an agreement Monday that calls for initiating construction of the super collider next year.

The agreement, sought by committee members John Bryant of Dallas, Marvin Leath of Waco and Dick Army of Copper Canyon, also authorizes at least \$200 million be spent on the particle accelerator in fiscal 1990.

"The committee recognizes that the SSC represents an extraordinary opportunity to maintain U.S. leadership in science in technology," according to the panel's budget document. "The SSC will provide valuable technological advance in such areas as medical treatment, computers, electronics and superconducting magnets."

The Energy Department wants to build the 53-mile underground ring at a site south of Dallas, and President Bush is asking Congress to spend \$250 million to begin construction in fiscal 1990.

Bryant, a Democrat, said the budget agreement is "very important because it's a statement of policy that we intend the money for construction."

Mexican protesters burn rally tickets

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Helmeted soldiers and police officers on horseback kept the opposition out of a massive government-organized Labor Day rally Monday as protesters shouted anti-government slogans and burned tickets for the march.

The tickets were issued to members of pro-government unions and permitted entry to a 90-block area around the Zocalo, the city's main plaza. The government said 1.5 million took part, but the actual crowd was closer to 150,000.

Blue wire fences were set up at intersections and thousands of police were called in to keep out gate-crashers. In past years, police and independent union workers clashed over entry to the traditionally pro-government march.

"We're workers, and we have the right to march and let the leaders hear our voice," leftist leader Rosario Ibarra de Piedra, who burned tickets with protesters in front of police lines, said. "They're violating our constitutional rights."

"Sure, they have the right to march to the Zocalo," C. Villanor, a police lieutenant who refused to give his first name, said. "But it's closed. They can't get in."

West Germany pursues weapon talks

BONN, West Germany (AP) — The government began a new effort Monday to rally NATO allies behind its proposal for superpower talks on reducing short-range nuclear weapons, causing a dispute with the United States and Britain.

Foreign Minister Hans-Dietrich Genscher was quoted as saying West Germany's argument must have "special weight" because it is the alliance's front line and a war with such battlefield-range weapons would be fought on its territory.

Both the United States and Britain say the negotiations proposed by Chancellor Helmut Kohl might endanger Western security.

Genscher's remarks were the first official West German comment since a meeting Sunday in which Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher of Britain tried, but failed, to change Kohl's mind on the issue.
