TV Q&A

Q. Is Tony Danza's personal life anything like his role on "Who's the Boss?"

A. Hardly. While on-screen Danza is a housekeeper, off-screen Danza heads his own production company, named Katherine Anne after his 2-year-old daughter. His recent film, "She's Out of Control," was one of the company's projects. Danza and his wife, Tracy Robinson, are the parents of Katherine, and he has custody of his teen-age son, Marc Anthony, from his first marriage. His daughter from his previous marriage lives with her mother.

Q. I recently saw the 1966 movie "The Trap" on cable. It starred a wonderful actor named Oliver Reed. Tell me about him. — L.S., Northbrook, Ill.
