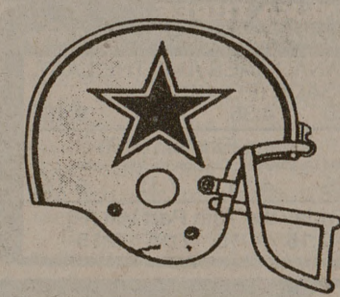
SAN MARCOS (AP) — Bruce Davis does an excellent 300-pound verbal tap dance when asked about his weight.
