## Moscow urges Moladavian leaders to accept compromise to stop strike

MOSCOW (AP) — Moldavian leaders tried to placate outraged minority groups on Wednesday by considering a watered-down version of a plan to make their native tongue the official language of the ethnically diverse republic.

Moldavian leaders, reportedly at the urging of Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev, were leaning toward adopting the compromise to try to stop strikes by Russians and other groups opposed to the pending language law.

Non-Moldavians are reported to be on strike at 200 businesses and industries in the tiny southern republic bordering Romania. The official Tass news agency said rail workers in several cities Wednesday joined the walkouts.

The initial proposal would make only Moldavian the official language of the republic. The compromise plan would make Moldavian the language of government officials and documents, and Russian would be the language for everyday contacts between the republic's ethnic groups.

Moldavia's Communist Party chief, Semen Grossu, suggested the compromise Wednesday to the republic's Supreme Soviet legislature after speaking with Gorbachev on the telephone, Tass said.

Grossu did not say whether Gorbachev had gestured the compromise although that is widely believed to be the case, said Vasily Nestase of the pro-Moldavia People's Front, speaking by telephone from the republic's capital, Kishinev.

Moldavia now has no law specifying which language is to be used, but Russian traditionally has been the tongue for government affairs and it is dominant in commerce, which upsets native Moldavians.

The compromise would cut a part of the language law that would have made Moldavian the language of communication among Russians, Ukrainians, Jews, Bulgarians and other ethnic groups in the republic.

The initial law goes farther than the language law of a number of other republics. Many non-Moldavians do not speak Moldavian, but they share some knowledge of Russian as a result of Soviet schooling.

Grossu suggested adding a line in the Moldavian constitution that would specify using Russian as the language of inter-ethnic communication, Tass reported.

People's Front activists who are backing the language law said they were inclined to accept Grossu's suggestion.

"The best thing to do is to get involved," Olona said. The way to learn about the more than 300 organizations on campus is to read posted notices in the MSC and the Pavilion.

Olona said students are welcome to use the free counseling services provided in the YMCA building. The services include individual counseling and academic or career walk-in services. Someone is available to help 24 hours a day, Olona said.

At the rally, Cheri Zdziarski, student financial aid adviser, talked about money management. Students need to set realistic goals when creating a budget, Zdziarski said.

Zdziarski's tips included buying used books, using a bus pass instead of driving, doing laundry yourself, bringing lunch instead of buying on campus, using a checking account and going to the dollar theatre.

"Keep a budget that is flexible for unexpected expenses and re-evaluate

The free financial aid services provided in the Pavilion are available to all students, she said. Services include personal financial aid counseling, budget information, scholarship information, debt management counseling and a short-term emergency loan program.

The ministry's main goal is dedicated to caring for the needs of the disadvantaged, abused and neglected citizens of the Brazos County in areas such as providing food, shelter, clothing, and other necessities to anyone regardless of religion, race, color, or national origin. The Mission will help those who can demonstrate acute need (including students), but does not give money.

"Other agencies are better at giving

ing money than we are, so we generally provide material items to those who would otherwise fall between the cracks," Thomas said.

Unlike most missions, however, Twin City strongly encourages the aid recipients to help out as store volunteers and repair persons.

"Even though our temporary shelter facilities are not that nice, they are luxuries to many, and in return we require their help," Thomas said. "No one comes to play and freeloader are the exception."

The money from the new semester chance stores in 1988 enabled Twin City Mission to provide meals, 13,410 nights of lodging and 572 emergency food baskets.

"The Twin City Mission Store Chance stores, which serve as the financial backbone of the program, offer good services to students," Thomas said. "We're making things work for another."
