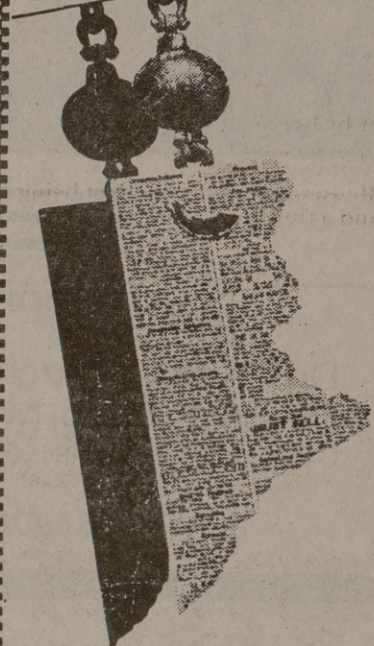

Study says birth control pills do not increase risk of cancer

BOSTON (AP) — The largest study ever to examine the effects of birth control pills offers reassuring evidence that middle-aged women who didn't first take the pill until their mid-20s face no unusual risk of breast cancer.
"Past use of oral contraceptives does not appear to increase the risk of breast cancer for women in their mid 40s and 50s," said Dr. Walter C. Willett of the Harvard School of Public Health.
While the research is good news for older women, it does not dispel worries that younger women who took the pill throughout their teens and early 20s may have an increased risk of this common form of cancer.
The study of 118,273 women is the largest of several released this

year that have provided conflicting evidence about the possible role of birth control pills in triggering breast cancer.
Some experts worry that taking the pill during the early reproductive years may somehow increase the risk. Others note that the amount and ratio of sex hormones in birth control pills have changed since their introduction in the early 1960s, and this also might have made the pill more hazardous.
"The epidemiologists are all confused, myself included," said Dr. Samuel Shapiro of Boston University's Sloan Epidemiology Unit, a co-author of one of the recent studies.
Shapiro found in studying pill users under 45 that of those who took oral contraceptives for 10 years or

more, the risk of breast cancer was increased four times.
A study from University Hospital in Lund, Sweden, found that women who took the pill while teen-agers in the 1960s have about five times the usual risk of breast cancer before they reach menopause.
An Oxford University study of women under age 35 who had been early pill users found a 74 percent increase in the breast cancer risk after eight years.
"Our study does not directly contradict those studies," Willett said. "It raises an element of doubt about them, but there is no strong relation, because it's possible that the (pill's) effects really are different in very young women."

partment," he said.
Steven Rinard, marine program manager for the southern region of the NWS, said that A&M demonstrated interest in the research institute.
"A&M has always been active in applied meteorological research," Rinard said. "We've been working with Dr. Scoggins."
Scoggins said he believes that the institute's research will be practical and beneficial, both to A&M and the NWS.

"(The research will) apply fundamental knowledge to the solution of problems," Scoggins said.
Rinard, who is a 1964 graduate of A&M, also stressed the function of the institute in increasing interaction between the University and the federal government.
"Many times there is quite a distance between academia and operations," Rinard said. "The difference is applied research."
Rinard said the research performed at CIAMS will be operational and applicable to immediate situations as opposed to hard, strictly theoretical research.
Rinard said the NWS defined several areas that it felt needed research. A&M will supply that re-

search, he said.
Scoggins said that A&M was not competing with another university for the institute, but establishing the institute at A&M was not easy.
"It takes a lot of groundwork," he said. "First of all, a university must establish need, then prove that it has the needed expertise to conduct the appropriate research."
CIAMS will benefit Texas, as well as Texas A&M, Scoggins said.
"It will benefit Texas through improved weather forecasting," he said. "It will provide a first-rate educational opportunity for our students."
The institute also will provide research opportunities for Texas A&M faculty, he said.

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
