administrator to organize and develop the necessary infrastructure and business systems for managing a large-scale operation. To date, Mr. Johnson has not exhibited these skills or his orientation."

Johnson would not say Friday whether he intended to leave the organization or what action might be taken in response to the report.

"I have no comment because it is in the hands of a study committee of our board," Johnson said.

Board Chairman Carlos Morris said he backs Johnson.

"From my standpoint, I think that he has done and is doing a great job," Morris said. "If we had more money, we should give him more help. That's our only problem, we're a little deficient in having enough money all the time... We're going to talk to United Way about that whole report."

The study was demanded by the United Way after reports that the mission was beset with health and safety problems, violence and mis-

management. The Star of Hope board of directors joined in requesting the review.

United Way formerly provided about 20 percent of Star of Hope's \$3.6 million annual operating budget. But earlier this year, United Way cut funding and put the mission on probation.

In months before the study was commissioned, the mission was cited for violating local health and safety codes. Private investigators hired by United Way reported seeing criminal violence and unsanitary conditions at a men's shelter.

Federal officials canceled the Star of Hope's authorization to accept food stamps at the men's shelter because of policy violations that included accepting the stamps as payment for beds. Monthly food stamps had come had amounted to about \$10,000.

The report concludes by saying the Star of Hope can quickly get back on track if it recruits better leadership, develops an effective planning process and is more careful about administrative and financial management.
