method of processing. In Harlingen, agents late Wednesday night said they were nervous about having \$1 billion worth of cocaine parked in two large Ryder trucks behind their local office.

"This according to our headquarters in Austin is the largest cocaine seizure in Texas, and probably the second largest in the U.S.," Bullard said.

"We have marked and unmarked cars and also an aerial escort" protecting the cocaine, DPS spokesman Mike Cox said Thursday morning as the trucks were making the 300-mile journey to Austin.

Jim Murray, assistant commander of the DPS Narcotics Service, said he was not certain how disposal of the cocaine would be handled.

In the past, the DPS has hired private companies to burn drugs, Murray said, but added, "We've never experienced anything like this before."

although no meeting has been set.

Earlier this year Trump acquired Eastern Airlines' profitable Northeast shuttle for \$365 million, adding it to an empire built mainly on huge real estate holdings that include hotels and Atlantic City, N.J., casinos.

Trump said his experience with the shuttle has given him "substantial insight" into airline competition and he praised AMR management for putting the company "in a unique position to respond to an increasingly competitive environment."

Trump said he intended for current management to continue running AMR and "work with me to build on the company's reputation as the premier airline in the industry."

AMR has enjoyed strong financial results in recent years and is the biggest U.S. airline, with an industry-leading 21.8 percent domestic market share. It's also engaged in a major expansion that includes a multi-billion-dollar jetliner buying binge.

The company is considered an attractive candidate because of its dominant market position, gates in many regional airports, airlines on order and ownership of the industry's largest computer reservation system.

votes lower than last year.

"Of all four polling places, the MSC and the Academic Plaza (the area between the Academic Building and the Sterling C. Evans Library) had the highest voter turnouts with 433 and 342 votes (respectively), she said. "The polling places and times for the runoff elections will be the same as they were for the regular elections. We hope to have just as good of a turnout this Tuesday for the runoff."

There were a total of 973 voters. The runoff for freshman class president is between Bill Benker and Esther Cochran. Benker is a General Studies major from Houston and Cochran is a political science major from Plano.

Cochran said her biggest asset is that she has leadership skills from being really active in her high school. She said that if elected she would work to start a canned-food drive competition between the A&S freshman class and the freshman class at the University of Texas, hoping it would become a new tradition.
