49ers score late TDs, drop Cowboys 31-14

IRVING (AP) — Not even Herschel Walker could have saved the Dallas Cowboys from a loss on Sunday to those ultimate NFL road warriors, the San Francisco 49ers.

The defending world champions inflicted a sixth consecutive loss on the Walker-less Cowboys 31-14 on Sunday in which Dallas could produce only 60 yards rushing.

"It was a 10 a.m. (West Coast time) game for us and we didn't wake up until 1 p.m. or 2 p.m.," said San Francisco coach George Seifert. "Every game is a dogfight for us."

the worst start since 1960. Dallas was the only winless team in the NFL.

Montana sat out the game with a sore elbow and the Cowboys played their first game without Walter. He traded away to Minnesota on Tuesday.

"We lost a great player in Herschel but it made our other players look at each other and do their part," Johnson said.

Seifert said he thought about trading Montana in the game in the third period when Dallas made a surge.

"It just flashed through my mind," Seifert said. "We wanted to get through this game without Steve Young because of his bruised elbow. Artificial turf isn't good on it, glad we didn't use him."

Two big defensive plays blocked field goal cashed for a touchdown, and Tom Holmoe's interception helped the 49ers.

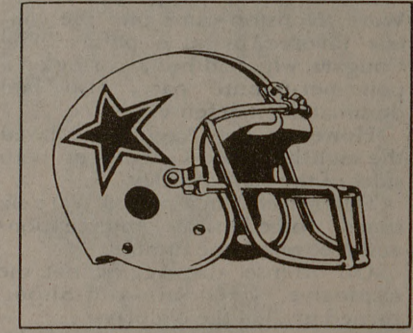
With the game tied at 14-14 in the fourth period, Holmoe intercepted Steve Walsh and returned it 29 yards to the Dallas 20.

"Those two defensive plays were really big," Seifert said. "They helped get us going."

On third down from the Dallas 40, Young lobbed an end zone pass to Rice who beat cornerback Everett Walls with 11:39 to play.

Young later found Tom Ralston with a 36-yard pass to set up Mike Cofer's clinching 31-yard field goal. Young also scrambled 22 yards to position the 49ers for Roger Craig's one-yard scoring run with 1:57 left.

"I thought Steve played a great game," Seifert said.



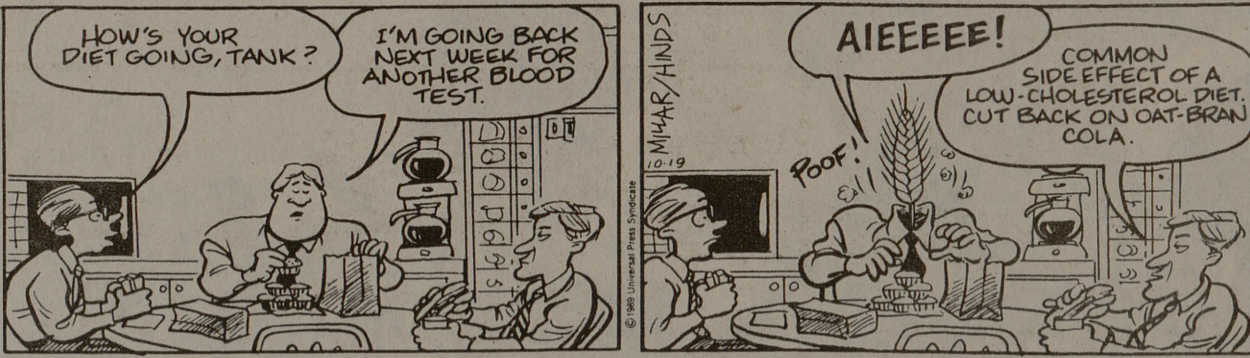
and Steve Young's successful 1989 debut as a starter proved too much for the Cowboys, who are still looking for coach Jimmy Johnson's first professional win.

"San Francisco did exactly what they've done all year," Johnson said. "They made the plays in the fourth quarter to win when they had to."

A's take 2-0 Series lead

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Give Oakland credit for pitching, power and prophecy and give the Athletics a 2-0 lead in the World Series.

Oakland again made short work of San Francisco, beating the Giants 5-1 Sunday night and threatening to turn the Bay Bridge meeting into a one-way affair.

Terry Steinbach, playing on a hunch by Manager Tony La Russa, hit a three-run homer in the fourth inning that made it 5-1 and ended any suspense. Rickey Henderson went 3-for-3 with a walk and now has reached base in 20 of 32 postseason plate appearances.

Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Dennis Eckersley held the Giants four hits, one day after Dave Stenstrom shut them out on just five. San Francisco's only consolation came in the form of a 23-inning scoreless World Series streak that began in 1962.

For the Giants, a dangerous situation has suddenly gotten desperate. They went into the series with two healthy starters, and Scott Lincecum and now Rick Reuschel have been hit hard.

Of the 39 teams that took a lead in the World Series, 29 went on to win.
