








neir being killed or moved. Other students said they were not nformed on the expansion, and felt twas unfair students' views were not

aken into account. Hodge said the committee that studied the expanding needs of the University Center was formed in Ocober 1984, and in November 1986 gan. Details on the design have been

oned out since November 1988. "The project has been discussed with four student body presidents, student government members and MSC council members," Hodge said. They were aware of all the aspects f the project. We can't do anything f that information was not passed

Many students said they were not ware of the expansion plans, especially plans concerning the movement and cutting of the oaks, ntil about six months ago

The discussion then shifted to talk of a referendum. A member of student government said if students were serious about a referendum, they need to stop by the student government office and find out the corect procedure.

plans, could the plans be changed? Hodge said that was a difficult

question to answer. "The approval (of such a project) comes from the Board of Regents," he said. "So I don't know. I'm not here to tell you that what you're doing is wrong," he said. "If you're going to object at least do it has a going to object, at least do it based on the facts. If you're going to say we shouldn't cut down four trees, then that's fine. That's your right to do that. My only concern is that you don't say we're cutting down 26 live

Hodge also said he was not attempting to defend the cutting down of the live oaks, nor did he represent the views of members of the Board of Regents.

"I just want to make sure everybody understands the current status of the project.'

In an emotional appeal, one student said she thought the "A" in Texas A&M stood for agriculture, and "not for administration." She said the views of the students should

be considered. Hodge said the expansion includes an expanded bowling and games area, a food court, larger vo-cal music facilities, art galleries and procedure. gallery storage, a larger bookstore, woman asked that if enough an expanded student programs of-

The expansion of the Rudder Theater Complex includes an outdoor stage, and a 500-seat lecture hall and movie theater.

'A parking garage and an "L"-shaped building will be constructed near the aerobic jogging trail and Mount Aggie. The "L"-shaped structure, called the Lot 60 Building for partial structure, called the Lot 60 Building for the structure of the str now, will contain student activities offices currently located in the Pavilion. The building also will contain student government offices, multicultural services office, KANM studio, student senate's meeting room, off-campus center offices, the parking and transit department, the athletic department, the placement center, the cooperative education of-

fice and the school relations office.

Building construction should be completed by October or November of 1991 and the parking garage should be finished by September

"The bad part of this is that most of you won't be able to see the results," Hodge told the audience. You're just going to live through

the construction."

He said that with the expansion, the Rudder Fountain area will be closed for two years and Ring Dance will have to be different this year. He could not elaborate on new plans for


