Aggie Flashback

The following information was gathered from past issues of *The Battalion* and reflects issues that occurred during this week in A&M's history.

10 years ago — In letters to the editor of *The Battalion*, students wrote to express their concern about receiving better information about rapes on campus. The students wanted to see factual news articles about on-campus safety rather than having to rely on gossip.
25 years ago — A student from Baylor painted the Lawrence Sullivan Ross statue green during the Baylor-Texas A&M football game weekend.
50 years ago — Fifteen new campus buildings, including dormitories, a mess hall and two engineering buildings were named. The names were selected from among former presidents of Texas A&M, directors and outstanding citizens. Some of the new buildings named were Duncan Dining Hall, H.H. Harrington Classroom Building and F.C. Bolton Hall.
75 years ago — A&M and the University of Texas were seeking to achieve more friendly relations between the two schools. UT sent the A&M football team complimentary tickets to see UT play Oklahoma in Dallas. It was also the intention of the A&M Corps of Cadets to root for UT during the game as a representation of the growing friendliness between the two institutions.

has stood just to the left of popular music, adding their quirky flavor to some of this decade's best melodies. Stipe's haunting lyrics, Buck's jangly riffs, and Berry/Mill's tranquil rhythms have satisfied America's alternative circles, while enrapturing mainstream FM listeners.
In the truest sense, R.E.M. has become the classic crossover band, fusing together the previously incompatible underground and top-40 audiences into one big R.E.M. coalition.
Tagging along for the show is Pylon, a fellow Athens band that is receiving great praise for their current reunion tour. Egged on by R.E.M.'s proclamation that Pylon is their favorite band, guitarist Randy Bewley, bassist Michael Lacowski, drummer Curtis Crowe and vocalist Vanessa Briscoe have reformed, releasing a greatest hits CD.
Pylon coupled with R.E.M. make a Sunday night show that is a "can't miss." Hey, I'll be the first to admit that R.E.M. has lost their early spunk and sprouted out an extra head, but miss the show — NO WAY!
