Rockets starting season with ailing Akeem

HOUSTON (AP) louston Rockets open the reguar season Friday night with cener Akeem Olajuwon slowed by an off-season blood clot in his leg and three other players on the injured list.

But the positive-thinking Olajuwon says he's ready to get the season started in Los Angeles

against the Clippers. "I'm taking this as a challenge," Olajuwon said. "I don't know how nany minutes I'll be able to play in the opening game. But I plan

to make them quality minutes. I'm going to play as hard as I can for as long as I can and build on that from game to game

Olajuwon hasn't played in a game since May 5 when Seattle eliminated the Rockets from the NBA playoffs.

He took two months off after the season and had just started working out again when a blood clot was discovered in his left calf.

Olajuwon was unable to participate in any contact work until he stopped taking blood thinners on

Saturday. Now he's medically 100 percent, but being physically prepared for a rigorous 82-game schedule is another matter.

Center Tim McCormick underwent arthroscopic knee surgery on Wednesday and joined guards Mike Woodson and Byron Dinkins on the injury list.

"It's not a catastrophe, because we've got Larry Smith and Otis Thorpe, who also can play center," coach Don Chaney said.
"These are the kinds of injuries that happen early in the year. Hopefully, Tim will be back quickly. He had been having an

impressive camp."
Chaney tried to see the bright

side of having injured players. "With three players going on the injured list, it enables us to buy some time," Chaney said. "But we've still got decisions to make down the line when these players are ready to come back."

The Rockets' home opener is Tuesday against the Portland Trail Blazers.

Sheri Hermesmeyer had a .256 nitting average and a career-high 15 kills for the Lady Aggies


Coach Al Givens said his team now has the role of spoiler.
