Lawmakers unveil overhauled program for workers' comp

AUSTIN (AP) — Two state senators Monday unveiled an overhaul of the Texas workers' compensation system designed to cut premiums and reduce accidents by tightening insurance regulations and penalizing unsafe employers.

State lawmakers on Nov. 14 begin a special legislative session on reforming the insurance system that compensates workers injured on the job.

Sens. Carl Parker and Kent Caperton said safety and insurance reform will prevent job accidents and save employers hundreds of millions of dollars in workers' comp premiums.

"Without deaths or injuries, the system never kicks in," Parker, D-Port Arthur, said.

They said the plan also addresses business concerns by reducing attorney involvement in workers' comp cases and penalizing parties pursuing frivolous legal claims.

It also would cut comp rates by 15 percent over two years and, over five years, phase in mandatory coverage for employers with five or more employees.

The proposal maintains the for an injured worker to appeal administrative benefits ruling jury trial. "We can cut rates and abridge the right of the worker," Caperton, D-Bryan, said.

State Rep. Richard Smith, House leader on workers' comp, he had not seen the senators' bill. Smith said his legislation, he said, will be filed by Monday also include a 15-percent rate cut.

"Every conceivable concern has been discussed ad nauseum, down to getting votes," Smith, Bryan, said.

Both Smith and Caperton they believed it will probably the entire 30-day special session to reach an agreement.
