

Officials try to interview officer who shot woman

lice Department internal affairs investigators tried for the first time Tuesday to interview an officer who fatally shot a woman during a freeway shootout last week but failed because he was "too medicated," offi-

cials said. Officer Alex Gonzales, 25, has remained in Hermann Hospital since the shootout Oct. 31, in which he was wounded and Ida Lee Delaney, 50, was killed.

Both the FBI and the police partment on Monday acknowled Gonzales had consumed nearly to the amount of alcohol allowed by before he shot and killed Delane.
A police official confirmed of zales' blood tests — acquired for

Hermann Hospital through a Har County grand jury — revealed a percent alcohol-blood content. state law, a person is considered toxicated with at least a .10 percentage. measure of alcohol.
