# Mexican authorities hold German man for killings

MEXICO CITY (AP) — Mexican authorities said Wednesday they are investigating the possibility that a West German man being held for the killings of three Germans and two Danish tourists in Mexico may have killed other Europeans in various states around the country.

"It looks as if there are more victims," federal Attorney General's spokesman Arturo Antelmo told the Associated Press by telephone.

The federal murder investigation has expanded from the west coast state of Guerrero and east coast state of Veracruz to include the south-central states of Puebla and the state of Mexico, where other bodies have been found, Antelmo said.

Police arrested Diego Bohmern in the Pacific Coast resort of Acapulco when a car he was driving rammed into another driven by German tourist Hans Bertamsisi, and Bohmern began beating up on Bertamsisi, the government news service Notimex quoted federal judicial police as saying.

Officers discovered that Bohmern was in the country illegally and turned him over to federal agents. An investigation was coordinated with Interpol, the international law enforcement group.

Another Attorney General's office spokesman said Bohmern was being held in the killing of a West German couple in July in the southern state

of Oaxaca, another German and Danes. The bodies of Katrin Nicolau and Sebastian Hedemann, 25, found buried in the tiny town of chutla in early October.

They were returned to West Germany on Oct. 22, after German agents identified them, the newspaper La Jornada reported.

# MADD seeks ban on Texas' happy hours

AUSTIN (AP) — A statewide coalition of parent and medical groups, led by Mothers Against Drunk Driving, plans to ask the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission to ban "happy hours" and prohibit or limit alcohol sales in high-crime neighborhoods and near college campuses.

If adopted, the 38-point plan — advocated by a coalition that includes the Texas PTA and the Texas Medical Association — would represent one of the most sweeping curbs in the public consumption of alcohol since Prohibition.

"Our goal is to not have underage people served or sold alcohol and to curtail the quantity of alcohol sold to a person who is alcohol-impaired," Karen Thorell, state administrator for MADD said.

The proposals could significantly alter how the liquor industry advertises its products, virtually eliminating ads aimed at young people. State regulators and representatives of the liquor industry say some proposals have merit but probably would violate the Texas Constitution.

"We have quite a few problems with some of (the proposals) because they appear to be contrary to state

law or they violate the state Constitution or they are already encompassed under the current law," said Joe Darnall, general counsel of the Alcoholic Beverage Commission, which issues liquor, wine and beer licenses.

"A city or a county or a justice of the peace precinct can be 'dry,'" Darnall said, "but under the current statute, you cannot legally ban alcohol from a neighborhood, even if the neighborhood is high-crime."

Leaders of the coalition, called Texans for Responsible Alcohol Consumption, have decided to present their proposals to the Alcoholic Beverage Commission at its Nov. 27 meeting.

The plan includes requiring establishments that serve alcohol to keep a log with the date, time and Texas driver's license number of every person who buys a drink.

Bars and restaurants also would have to establish "a method of counting drinks served to each individual customer." They would have to record such information as the size of the customer, the type of drink served and the time it was served, according to a draft prepared by the coalition.

# Racial fight quelled by prison guard

MIDWAY (AP) — Prison guards had to use tear gas to quell a disturbance involving 40 inmates that officials said was racially motivated, officials said Wednesday.

David Nunnelee, a spokesman for the Texas prison system, said the fight occurred about 10 p.m. Tuesday in the dayroom of the Ferguson Unit near Midway. "It appears to be a racial thing," he said of the mostly black and Hispanic inmates involved. "It was some sort of power struggle."

One inmate was transferred to the prison infirmary in Houston, Nunnelee said. Another inmate was treated and released from the unit's infirmary, he said.

The prison was under a lockdown for about two hours, Nunnelee said. He added that guards did not locate any weapons.

# State Dept. decides fate of royal ranch

LUBBOCK (AP) — The State Department is not quite sure what to do with a house formerly owned by the Shah of Iran's eldest son that the U.S. has decided to lease \$567 million in Iranian assets.

The spacious ranch house, occupied by Prince Reza Pahlavi, remained under control of the Department since Iranian assets in the United States were frozen in 1980 following the seizure of the U.S. embassy in Tehran.

"It's hard to tell what will happen to a specific piece of real estate opposed to a transfer of funds," State Department spokesman George Malleck said from Washington. "There may be a decision about what we'll be doing with the house, but I just don't know for certain."

The Iranian government bought the house in 1978 for \$265,000, home for the young prince who attended pilot training at Reese Air Force Base. He completed training eight months before Iranian militants seized about 60 hostages at the U.S. embassy in Tehran in November 1979.

The revolutionary government of Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini took control of the Lubbock house. In months preceding the U.S. government's seizure of Iranian assets, the house was sold for \$625,000, but there were no takers.

"I don't know why, but they placed a high value on the house," Stephen Von Phul, a Lubbock estate agent and the property trustee, said.

# Houston officer accused of soliciting prostitutes

HOUSTON (AP) — A Houston police officer remained free on bond Wednesday after being accused of extorting sex from prostitutes while on duty.

Officer Phillip S. O'Keefe, 33, was arrested early Tuesday after he allegedly solicited sexual favors from an undercover policeman, who was posing as a prostitute, and picked her up in his marked police car near the Astrodome.

The four-year police veteran, an accident investigator, was named in a sealed indictment returned Nov. 2. The indictment accuses him of violating one prostitute's civil rights in August when he allegedly got her into his patrol car under the guise of an arrest, then took her to a remote location for sex.

He also was charged with official oppression.

O'Keefe, who is free on a \$2,000 bond, faces a Dec. 5 arraignment before State District Judge Mike Wilkinson. He has been placed on paid administrative leave, police spokesman Dan Turner said.

The case is the third this year in which a Houston police officer has been accused of forcing women to

have sex.

"He drove by her (the undercover officer) about four times, but he didn't stop because he had a passenger with him," said Don Smyth, a prosecutor in the Harris County district attorney's civil rights division. "So they baited the hook one more time, and finally he hit on her."

Internal Affairs investigators followed O'Keefe and when it became apparent that he was not taking the undercover female officer to jail, he was arrested.

In O'Keefe's patrol unit, Smyth said, the conversation between the officer and the woman centered on whether she was really a prostitute. To prove it, Smyth said, O'Keefe demanded that the woman pull down her blouse. She refused.

Smyth said there was no videotape made of the sting operation but declined to say if the undercover policeman was wearing a microphone.

Police internal affairs investigators launched their investigation of O'Keefe on Sept. 27, after several prostitutes complained that a uniformed officer was soliciting sex acts, Turner said.
