That same direction is an indelible mix of contemporary melodies and country jangles, tinged with a flavor of '70s rock. This crossover style has naturally led to comparisons with the Eagles.

'We've never strived as a band for any one direction other than achieving a good sound," explains Stewart.
"What you hear on record is the combination of styles from five different performers who grew up liking different groups and artists.


