Abdul surprised by success

LOS ANGELES (AP) — When Paula Abdul was a child, she dreamed of following in the footsteps of such singing and dancing legends as Gene Kelly, Fred Astaire and Judy Garland.

Today, it looks as if the diminutive 26-year-old vocalist and choreographer could be on her way.

Abdul's debut album, *Forever Your Girl*, has sold more than 2 million copies. It also has generated three number-one singles: "Straight Up," "Forever Your Girl" and "Cold Hearted."

A fourth single, "The Way You Love Me," is also burning up the charts.

To top it off, she recently won three MTV awards for her music and videos, and won an Emmy for her choreography of "The Tracey Ullman Show."

She is understandably overwhelmed.

"I feel redundant when I keep saying, 'I'm overwhelmed' or 'I'm excited,' but it's really something you can't explain," she said. "It's just an inner feeling that you have. You smile and you laugh and you think, 'I'm a real lucky girl.'"

Abdul has come a long way from her days cheerleading for the Los Angeles Lakers.

She went to the audition with

girlfriends, but became discouraged when she saw hundreds of hopefuls milling about waiting for their chance to perform.

"I drove the girls that were auditioning with me so I had to wait for them. And at the very last second, after hours, I said, 'What the heck, I'm just gonna go ahead.'"

"I was a big basketball fan," she said. "I was a huge Laker fan and we each would get two season seats. What more could you want? The Lakers were really hot."

Soon after being selected as one of the 12 cheerleaders in 1981, the choreographer left to get married.

Abdul devoted herself to getting the Laker Girls noticed. She incorporated traditional cheerleading with jazzy dance steps and street moves.

The fans did notice — and the offers started pouring in for Abdul to choreograph. She helped smooth out dance steps for a music video by the Jacksons and did some commercial work.

Then she choreographed the videos for Janet Jackson's "What Have You Done for Me Lately?" and "When I Think of You," among others.

"I wasn't looking to become a ch-

oreographer really," Abdul said. "These were little jobs that came my way and it was something that was good money and it was fun."

Besides choreographing videos for Jackson, ZZ Top and the Pointer sisters, Abdul arranged dance steps for Aretha Franklin, Kool and the Gang and George Michael concert tours.

She also choreographed two films, "The Running Man" and "Coming to America."

But Abdul was still drawn to song. Abdul laughed as she talked recently about her break into the recording business.

She said the record company executives who worked with her on music videos kept asking, "So what do you want to do when you grow up, Paula?"

She would respond: "I want to be an artist on your label."

Finally two executives took her seriously and signed her to a recording deal. *Forever Your Girl* was the result.

She eventually wants to break into acting, and is considering several prospects.

"I definitely want to act," she said. "But I definitely want to continue making music and I'll never give up choreography."

Book lists iron humorous triv

NEW YORK (AP) — On Fourth of July in 1986, hundreds of Elvis Presley imitators will perform in the official celebration of the nation's unweaving of the refurbished Statue of Liberty.

That and 364 other nuggets of arcane information are contained in "The Pessimist's Journal: Very, Very Bad Days" (La Bionne), a calendar-like book compiled by Jess Brallier and Richard McDonough.

The book's first jaundiced entry reads: "Jan. 1. This is going to be one awful year, believe it or not, followed by a January which reports, 'Gen. drew Jackson's troops into a crushing 2,000 casualties in a crushing feat of the British forces at the Battle of New Orleans ... weeks after a treaty ended war (1815).'"

The litany doesn't end: March 15, 44 B.C., "shortly after 11 a.m., and only after he went to get him, Julius Caesar ters the newly built Senate."

The slim volume concludes appropriately enough, with: "31: 'Watch out, there's another year coming!'"
