Houston blasts Charlotte

HOUSTON (AP) — Mitchell Wiggins scored 10 of his game-high 24 points in the third period following the ejection of Akeem Olajuwon as the Rockets cruised to a 113-101 victory over the Charlotte Hornets Thursday night at the Summit.

Olajuwon and Charlotte rookie J.R. Reid were kicked out for fighting at 4:44 of the third quarter when they collided during a scramble for a rebound.

Both centers exchanged punches.

Olajuwon had hit all five of his shots in the third quarter and finished with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Houston was ahead 68-51 when Olajuwon and Reid were ejected.

Reid departed with 14 points and seven rebounds. Wiggins and Otis Thorpe took up the slack as Houston extended its lead to as much as 23 points on Thorpe's three-point play for an 89-66 lead with 8:45 left.

Kelly Tripucka, who led the Hornets with 22 points, scored 12 of them in the final period, but Charlotte couldn't cut the lead below 10.

Thorpe finished with 23 points and 13 rebounds, and Buck Johnson added 16 points and a career-high 11 rebounds.

Charlotte started the second quarter hitting only one of seven floor shots during a 14-4 Rockets surge that put Houston ahead 35-25 at the 8:50 mark.

Charlotte has lost all eight road games while Houston won for the fourth straight time.

Wiggins said Olajuwon's absence did not change the Rockets' game plan that much since both starting centers were eliminated.

"We had good ball movement all night," Wiggins said. "We just had to pick it up a notch and we did."

Johnson felt that the defense was the key to stepping up the Rockets' fast break.

"We pressured them on their shot attempts, picked off the rebounds and were able to get easy baskets by running," Johnson said.

"The good defense triggered a good offensive effort."

The Rockets rebounded 38 of Charlotte's 50 missed shots as the Hornets hit only 42.2 percent from the field.

"We wanted to be aggressive and put them away," Thorpe said.

"We've been sluggish against teams like Charlotte and we wanted to execute very well on defense."

Olajuwon said he respected Reid's style, but thought the game was a little too aggressive.

"I like physical players," Olajuwon said, "and I admire a rookie that's trying to establish himself by playing tough. He has confidence and that's great, but he doesn't have to take cheap shots."

Houston drops Hawaii-Loa 102-47

HOUSTON (AP) — Junior guard Byron Smith scored 12 points and five other Houston players scored in double figures as the Cougars easily defeated Hawaii-Loa 102-47 Thursday night at Hofheinz Pavilion.

Walter Rouse added 14 for the Cougars, and teammates Cal Herrera and Derrick Dandridge each added 11. Craig Upchurch and Chris Morris chipped in apiece for the Cougars.

Roger Huggins led the Mustangs with 16 points.

Houston, 2-1, scored 13 points before the Mustangs, 2-3, could get on the scoreboard.

The Cougars' fast break quickly put Hawaii-Loa down 5-12 with just over eight minutes play in the half.

Houston shot 74 percent from the field in the first half to build a 60-32 lead by halftime.

Kansas tops Idaho, 87-58

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Terry Brown led No. 4 Kansas with 19 points and six rebounds Thursday night and the Jayhawks cruised past Idaho 87-58.

Brown made four 3-point field goals and Kansas (5-0) went 8-for-16 from 3-point range.

Mark Randall added 17 points for the Jayhawks and Jeff Gueldner was perfect from 3-point range, 4-for-4, and finished with 13 points.

Kansas struggled with its passing early and had 10 turnovers but the Jayhawks made up for the mistakes with the outside shooting.

Idaho (2-1) opened in a zone defense and Kansas quickly took advantage, jumping to a 6-0 lead on two 3-pointers by Gueldner.

Spurs halt Aduabato's streak

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Richie Aduabato, the Dallas Mavericks' new coach, found out Thursday night that you can't win them all.

Terry Cummings scored 20 points, including a turnaround jumper with 47 seconds remaining, as the San Antonio Spurs beat Dallas 93-89 and handed Aduabato his first loss in two games since replacing John MacLeod.

"Nothing feels as good as a win," Aduabato said. "It's a difficult loss because we played well enough to win."

Rookie David Robinson had 15 points and 17 rebounds for the Spurs, who turned back a Dallas rally after leading by 12 in the fourth quarter. The Mavericks chipped away and pulled to 90-88 with 4:10 remaining.

San Antonio outscored Dallas 3-1 in the final four minutes, missing five of six free throws. Dallas could do better from the field. The Mavericks were led by Rolando Blackman and Derek Harper with 20 points apiece.

Aduabato credited Robinson's dominance in the middle as a key factor in the Spurs' victory.

"He intimidated our players in the middle," Aduabato said. "He's one of the league's premier blocked-shot players. He was the difference."

Robinson rejected five shots and Spurs coach Larry Brown echoed Aduabato's praise.

"The way David hit the defensive boards tonight was phenomenal," Brown said. "Defensively, I think we did the right things down the stretch."

"Dallas did a real good job of slowing down our offensive game," Brown said. "We just didn't execute the way we're supposed to, and they had a lot to do with it."

Cummings agreed that the Spurs did not appear ready to play.

"They (Dallas) came to play and we weren't in the game. We didn't come to play Thursday night, and against a team like Dallas you can't do that."
