not impressed upon them where their role in the environment is."

But apparently people are learning. In September, Sierra Club membership jumped 15 percent, from 200 to 235 members. Many of the new members are students, Worsham said.

"The people who are in it (the Sierra Club) appreciate the problems that are arising in the environment because of carelessness," Worsham said.

In addition to its efforts to educate, the Sierra Club sponsors monthly outings.

"When people go outdoors and see something, they appreciate it more," Worsham said. He said appreciation today means concern for and understanding of the problems that threaten the environment.

Worsham founded the Texas Environmental Action Coalition, a campus organization of which he is vice president.

Liz Edwards, co-president of TEAC, said the 150-member group is involved in direct action. She was a member of the Green Earth Society, a campus organization that no longer exists. When the Green Earth Society dissolved because of waning interest, Edwards went to TEAC's first meeting in February. She said she saw changes that had to be made in the organization, and she since has been an officer and a member.

Edwards said TEAC gave her an opportunity to do something about the environment. She said the Green Earth Society was not a direct-action organization, and its meetings consisted of 10 people showing up to watch movies.

But TEAC members get concerned and then they get others concerned, Edwards said.

"People from diverse backgrounds come together and work hard to make changes in the environment," she said. "I think that's one reason it appeals to so many people.

"I want to see changes made before we run out of water — before we can't step out in our backyard and breathe fresh air."

Edwards said social problems, such as homelessness and poverty, are actually second to environmental concerns.

"I don't see much of a difference if (people) don't have a safe place to live," she said. "Man has always fought nature.

"Nature's starting to lose, and that'll mean a losing battle for everybody."

Another local environmental group is Ducks Unlimited. Mike Palermo, owner of Palermo Taxidermy in Bryan and member of the Ducks Unlimited banquet committee, said the group focuses on raising money for improving breeding and feeding grounds for ducks.

"If it wasn't for that, we wouldn't have as many birds as we do now," Palermo said. "(But) it doesn't just improve life for ducks."

Mike Byington, Ducks Unlimited district chairman, said the group has worthwhile projects that benefit other animals as well as the environment.

Birds such as whooping cranes, eagles, pheasants and doves benefit from the group's restoration projects, he said.

Ducks Unlimited helps over 60 wildlife species, he said. The habitat of mule deer, white tail deer and moose are protected by Ducks Unlimited.

Some environmental groups, such as the Audubon Society, are specialized in their interests. Keith Arnold, president of the Audubon Society, said the society focuses activities for Brazos Valley bird lovers.

"We don't go out and promote environmental issues," Arnold said. "Our main purpose is to provide a focal point to look at birds in this region."
