Restaurant Report

The restaurants listed below were inspected by the Brazos County Health Department between Jan. 22 and Friday. Information is from a food service establishment inspection report.

SCORED BETWEEN 95 AND 100:
Reveille's Convenience Store at 300 Jersey St. **Score — 98.** Points were deducted for an inadequate hand-drying device.

SCORED BETWEEN 90 AND 95:
Winn Dixie at 4001 East 29th St. **Score — 94.** Points were deducted for unclean food-contact surfaces, unsatisfactory plumbing maintenance, unclean walls and ceilings, unclean non-food contact surfaces, unsatisfactory wall and ceiling construction and unnecessary articles on the premises.

SCORED BETWEEN 85 AND 90:
Ken Martin's Steak House at 3231 East 29th St. **Score — 89.** Points were deducted for unsatisfactory food protection during storage, unclean

non-food contact surfaces, unsatisfactory plumbing maintenance, unclean garbage containers, unsatisfactory walls and ceilings, unsatisfactory food-contact surface construction, unclean non-food contact surfaces, uncovered garbage containers and unsatisfactory outside storage areas.

Double Dave's Pizza at 4001 East 29th St. **Score — 87.** Points were deducted for unsatisfactory hygienic practices, unsatisfactory plumbing maintenance, unsatisfactory floors, unsatisfactory hair restraints, unclean walls and ceilings and outer openings unprotected from insects and rodents.

David Jefferson, a registered sanitarian at the department, said restaurants with scores of 95 or above generally have excellent operations and facilities. He said restaurants with scores in the 70s or low 80s usually have serious violations in the health report.

Scores can be misleading, Jefferson said, be-

cause restaurants can get the same score by fixing several minor violations or a few major violations. He said the minor violations can be corrected during the inspection. Point deductions or violations in the report range from one point (minor violations) to five points (major violations).

Jefferson said the department might close a restaurant if the score is below 60, the person has infectious diseases, the restaurant lacks adequate refrigeration, there is a sewage backup, the building or the restaurant has a complete lack of sanitization for the food equipment.

The department inspects each restaurant every six months. Jefferson said a follow-up inspection is sometimes required if a restaurant has a four- or five-point violation that cannot be corrected during the inspection, or if there are numerous small violations.

Inspectors at the department are registered sanitarians.
