States are Russian students who see how America's system works, and then go back and explain it, he said.

Also during the meeting, Timothy King, vice-chairman for the College Station Census Promotions Committee, said the census will be taken on April 1, 1990. The census, which is in its 200th year, is mandated by the U.S. Constitution.

In Bryan-College Station, a census form will be sent to all campus and off-campus addresses.

King stressed the importance of

filling out the forms because it not only insures Texas and each county proper representation in the legislature, but also determines funds the state and each county receives. Bryan-College Station is predicted to gain more state seats after the 1990 census, he said.

"The census is a statement of where we are today and a window for tomorrow for the nation," King said.

Kevin Buchman, student body president, reported that he and two other senators who are members of

the Advisory Committee for Undergraduate Studies, met with the Board of Regents last week. The purpose of this committee is to improve the quality of undergraduate education at A&M.

Adriana Menchaca, assistant speaker of the Senate, reported that A&M is still in competition with the George Bush Presidential Library.

New senators were sworn in by Buchman, and the chairs from Senate committees gave progress reports.

Police Beat

The following incidents were reported to the University Police Department between Jan. 26 and Thursday:

HARASSMENT:

- A man reported the harassment of himself and his fiancée. The couple occasionally meets at his office in Zachry Engineering Center for lunch. He believes personnel in his area do not think this is right. Beginning Jan. 15, unknown persons have placed notes or left messages in his office that he considers to be harassing and annoying. The fiancée received a telephone call at her residence on Jan. 24 in which the caller breathed heavily. Investigation continues.

- A student reported that someone is calling his room in Aston Hall approximately 10 times a day. The person placing the calls does not say anything and after approximately 10 seconds of silence hangs up the telephone.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF:

- A man was identified to be one of four individuals observed by a security officer cutting a tree near C-1 Lounge. The man said the individuals wanted to experience the feeling of cutting down a tree, and he went with them to supervise so that no one would get hurt. Investigation continues.

- Someone entered Easterwood Airport property and removed the electric eye and windsock from the mounting bracket located between runways 3 and 4. During the removal of the windsock, which is used by the pilot to determine wind directions, the mounting bracket was severely damaged. Investigation continues.

- A woman reported that someone slashed the right rear tire on her 1986 Ford Mustang parked in Parking Area 39.

- A woman reported that while parked on Lewis Street someone smashed the rear window of her 1987 Chevrolet Nova.

- A man reported that someone damaged the hood of his vehicle parked in Parking Area 32 by using a sharp object to scratch the paint.

MISDEMEANOR THEFT:

When the complainant relayed the information to the second man concerning the theft of his bicycle, the second man advised him to take the bicycle.

The complainant advised police that since his property had been returned he did not wish to know the identity of the subject. Investigation continues.

- A Swift model compound microscope was removed from Nagle Hall.
- Four green-and-red lens covers were stolen from Runway 28 at Easterwood Airport.

- A set of threading dies and heads were stolen from the University Power Plant.
- Two students reported their backpacks stolen. Both packs were unattended.
- Seven bicycles were reported stolen from various areas around campus.

ASSAULT:

- A woman was assaulted in her Mosher dorm room. The altercation resulted because of an ongoing feud between her and her assailant. Investigation continues.

BURGLARY OF A HABITATION:

- A man in Law Hall reported that someone entered his room and removed six pairs of socks from his laundry basket. Investigation continues.
- A Cain Hall resident reported that someone entered his residence hall room and removed his VHS portable compact disc radio, automatic VR 35 camera, answering machine and brown leather jacket.

MISDEMEANOR THEFT/FORGERY:

- A woman from Arlington, Texas, reported that her son's wallet and checkbook had been stolen and a check was written on his account at The Foodlocker in College Station.

When the son was contacted by UPD to obtain information on the theft of his property, he said his wallet and checkbook were stolen Jan. 14 from the Rudder Tower Lounge. The College Station Police Department has been notified of the forgery and will continue that portion of the investigation.

FELONY THEFT—RECOVERED:

- On Jan. 29, UPD was contacted by the San Antonio Police Department in reference to the recovery of a 1984 Datsun Pulsar which was recovered at the San Antonio International Airport.

The vehicle was reported stolen from Parking Area 89 on Nov. 18, 1989. The vehicle was placed in storage pending contact with the insurance company that now owns title to the vehicle.

The subject was identified and found to be a transfer student from A&M Consolidated High School. The boy's mother was contacted and informed that he would be transported to the Juvenile Detention Center in Bryan, and she could contact them concerning his release. Investigation continues.

- A student reported the theft of his blue parking permit from his 1985 Chevrolet Camaro in parking area 50.
