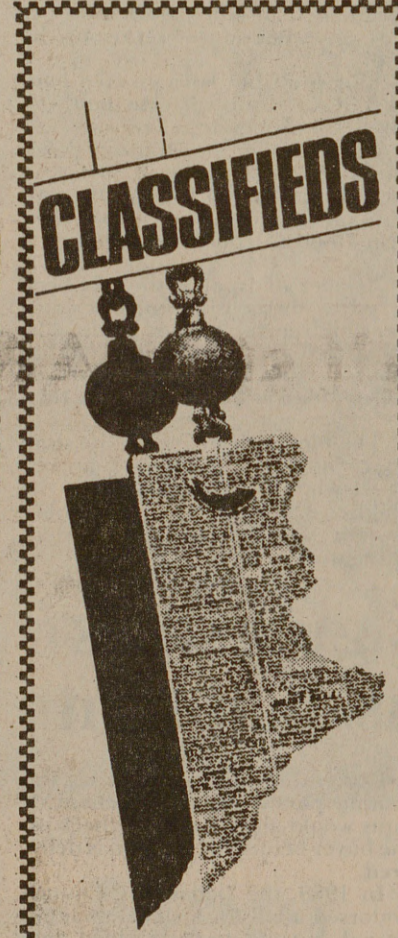

Power struggle wrecks havoc on jewelry co.

KERRVILLE (AP) — Like his jewelry, James Avery's company has always stood for Christian values and brotherly love. The corporate pledge spells out what he sells in silver doves and gold crosses: respect for tradition, Judeo-Christian ethics and the affirmation of them found in the Scripture. But behind this image of love and peace has erupted a power struggle scandalizing the town where Avery has been crafting crosses and other jewelry for more than 30 years. The bitter court battle pits ousted company president Charles Wolfmueller Jr. against the corporate patriarch, exposing a fight over everything from future profits to allegations of an extramarital relationship. Wolfmueller says he was wrongfully fired, and he wants compensation. Avery's estranged wife is trying to keep Wolfmueller's claims from interfering with her own divorce settlement involving the corporation. And in the process, Wolfmueller is pushing the Avery's private lives into public light, accusing Avery of letting an extramarital relationship shape his business decisions. Avery dismisses the suit and its accusations as "mudslinging." It's all a conversation-starter in this town of 20,000, where Wolfmueller is known as a former school board president and Avery once was voted "citizen of the year."

American sexuality not adventuresome Survey refutes popular beliefs

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — American adults say they have intercourse an average of once a week, but those over 70 have sex less than once a month; and one person in five claims to have abstained entirely in the past year, according to a survey released Sunday. The findings, based on a long-running survey of 1,500 households across the country, suggest that Americans are not as sexually adventuresome as they often are portrayed. "This shows that the sexual behavior of Americans is more circumspect and traditional than the libertine impression we get from the popular media and fiction," Tom W. Smith of the University of Chicago, who directed the survey, said. A separate survey found that teen-age boys are also less sexually active than their on-the-prowl image would imply. It found that adolescents seem to be having sex less often, with fewer girls and at a later age than teen-agers did a decade ago. "This contrasts sharply with the view that most young men are sexually promiscuous," Fredya L. Sonenstein of the Urban Institute in Washington, who analyzed the results, said. Both reports were among sex surveys outlined at a meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. The University of Chicago results were based on interviews and questionnaires administered to a cross-section of adults in 1988 and 1989. The questions were added to the General Social Survey, which has been conducted annually since 1972. Surprisingly little is known about the sex lives of ordinary Americans, Smith said.

Military discharges 5 alleged Klansmen

FORT WORTH (AP) — Five alleged Ku Klux Klan members are being discharged from the military because they are "active" members of the white-supremacist group, a Carswell Air Force Base official said. Membership alone is not a violation of military conduct codes, but "active" membership constitutes a violation, base spokeswoman Capt. Barbara Carr said. Carr said the administrative discharge recommendations were based on violations of an Air Force regulation that prohibits members from actively participating in supremacist causes or attempting to create illegal discrimination based on race. Under the regulation, "active participation includes publicly demonstrating or rallying, fund raising, recruiting and training members, and organizing or leading." Membership in the Klan does not

violate the Universal Code of Military Justice," the legal guidelines that govern all military personnel, Carr said. "The key word is 'active.' The discharges were recommended because the investigation revealed there was active participation." Carr said the airmen were members of the 7th Security Police Squadron, which patrols the flight line where bombers loaded with munitions are parked. They will get voluntary administrative discharge that entitle them to veterans benefits. Involuntary administrative discharge is a step-by-step process that systematically "separates" the airmen from the military. At each step, the airmen can respond to allegations in writing, she said. The commander reviews the response and makes a recommendation, and the discharge authority makes a final ruling.

Students show immunization records in class

LAREDO (AP) — About 80 junior high and high school students were required to prove Thursday that they received measles immunizations as health officials battled an outbreak of the illness. "We are not going to let students who do not show proof of immunization in school," Sharon Cruz, spokeswoman for the United Independent School District, said. District trustees voted last week to make measles vaccinations mandatory for all students in grades 7-12 after 15 measles cases were confirmed in the district. Students in affected grades were told last week about the measles vaccine requirement, Cruz said. The City Health Department reported 39 measles cases in Laredo by Wednesday. Of those, 29 were detected in the United school district. "We sent a letter home with those students failing to provide proof, notifying the parents that their children will not be allowed to remain in school," Cruz said. Should the students fail to attend classes because of lack of vaccine proof, they will not receive credit, she added. The only exceptions would be for students who could not present proof of vaccination because of medical or religious reasons. Those students will receive excused absences and be allowed to make up school work, Cruz said. Lisa Sanford, health department nursing director, said officials were concerned with three groups susceptible to measles: students in the United school district, pre-school children and youngsters who have never been
