Halbouty speaks on ethics

Texas A&M Distinguished Alumnus Michel T. Halbouty will speak about "Moral and Ethical Values in Free Enterprise" tonight at 7 in 701 Rudder. The presentation is sponsored by the MSC Great Issues Committee. Halbouty, an internationally renowned earth scientist and engineer, is chairman and chief executive officer of Halbouty Energy Company in Houston. Class of '30, he has been a leading figure in the energy business for over half a century. He established the Geosciences and Earth Resources Advisory Council at A&M, has endowed several academic positions, and the geosciences building bears his name. He has received the Distinguished Alumnus Award, the University's top honor for career achievement, in addition to many other honors. A reception honoring Halbouty will follow the presentation. 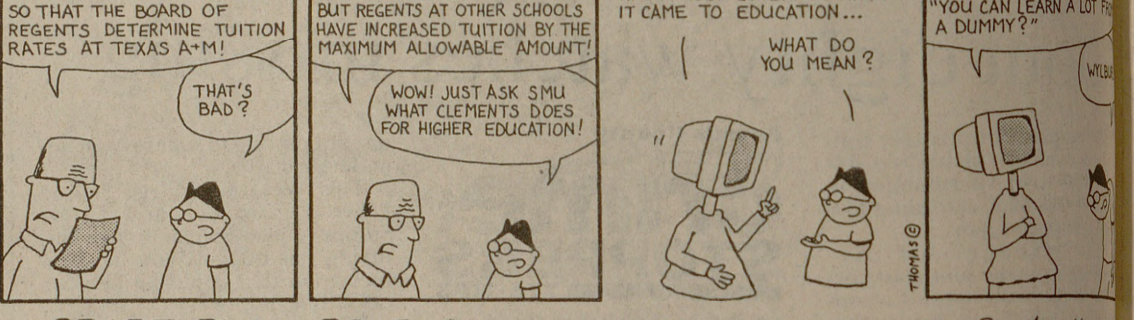
AIDS lecture presented
