SOUTH PADRE ISLAND (AP) Hotels this month are charging steep security deposits to make guests think twice about tossing fur-niture out the windows.

Bowling said he offered people a chance to come inside the student center and use the restrooms, but nobody did.

Female supporters said there is no sexual discrimination in any aspect of bonfire, and they also did not feel in danger of being attacked while

working on bonfire.

One faculty member and 22 students spoke at the hearing. However, time ran out before many people were given a chance to be heard.

Stout said anyone who wanted to peak, but couldn't, should mail written comments to the Faculty Senate office or the student government office. He said all written opinions must be received soon.

The committee is meeting after spring break, and will attempt to form an opinion soon after.

"I can't predict what the committee's opinion will be," Stout said. "I think most people realize this is not an all or nothing issue. It's very complex and emotional.
