Hanks, Ryan screen chemistry real, but 'Joe' doesn't live up to potential

Although Joe now has money, he still doesn't know what to do because he never considered what he wanted out of life. Ossie Davis appears and charms as a chauffeur who teaches Joe to dress with style.
