Government expands recall of common dietary supplement

WASHINGTON (AP) — The weight control. government expanded its recall of It has been labeled the L-tryptophan Thursday because of order called fears that a sometimes fatal blood disorder can be caused even by small

doses of the dietary supplement.
"We are confronted with a major public health problem," Health and Human Services Secretary Louis Sullivan warned in the announcement by the Food and Drug Admin-

'I urge everyone to stop taking these supplements immediately," he

L-tryptophan is an amino acid that occurs naturally in some foods that are high in protein, such as milk, beef, turkey and beans. But it

It has been linked to a blood dis-

order called eosinophilia-myalgia syndrome, or EMS.
So far, 1,411 cases of EMS — including 19 deaths — have been reported, the FDA said. Cases have been reported in every state.

The Council for Responsible Nutrition, which represents manufac-turers of nutritional supplements, endorsed the FDA's action. Its president, J.B. Cordaro, said "I wish they'd done it a month ago.

The council has been recommending for more than a month that its members stop distribution of products that contain L-tryptophan and that consumers stop using
