Pesticide levels remain constant, secretary says

TEMPLE (AP) — U.S. Agriculture Secretary Clayton Yeutter said those who are pushing for less pesticide use on commercial crops should be patient.

Although polls show that concern over pesticide residue is a growing issue, Yeutter said there has not been enough research to allow farmers to lower their pesticide use.

"We'd like to see the level of input in farming reduced — whether it be pesticides or herbicides or any other agricultural chemicals," Yeutter said. "But farmers cannot afford to take those steps until or unless they have definitive information that says

they can do so without putting themselves into bankruptcy.

"We can't be demanding that farmers reduce pesticide or agricultural chemical usage until we know that they can do so without reducing their net incomes."

Yeutter, speaking here Tuesday night, also said the Bush administration hopes to significantly increase the free trade of agricultural goods during current world trade negotiations.

"It is incredibly shortsighted for us to focus only on the domestic market," he said.

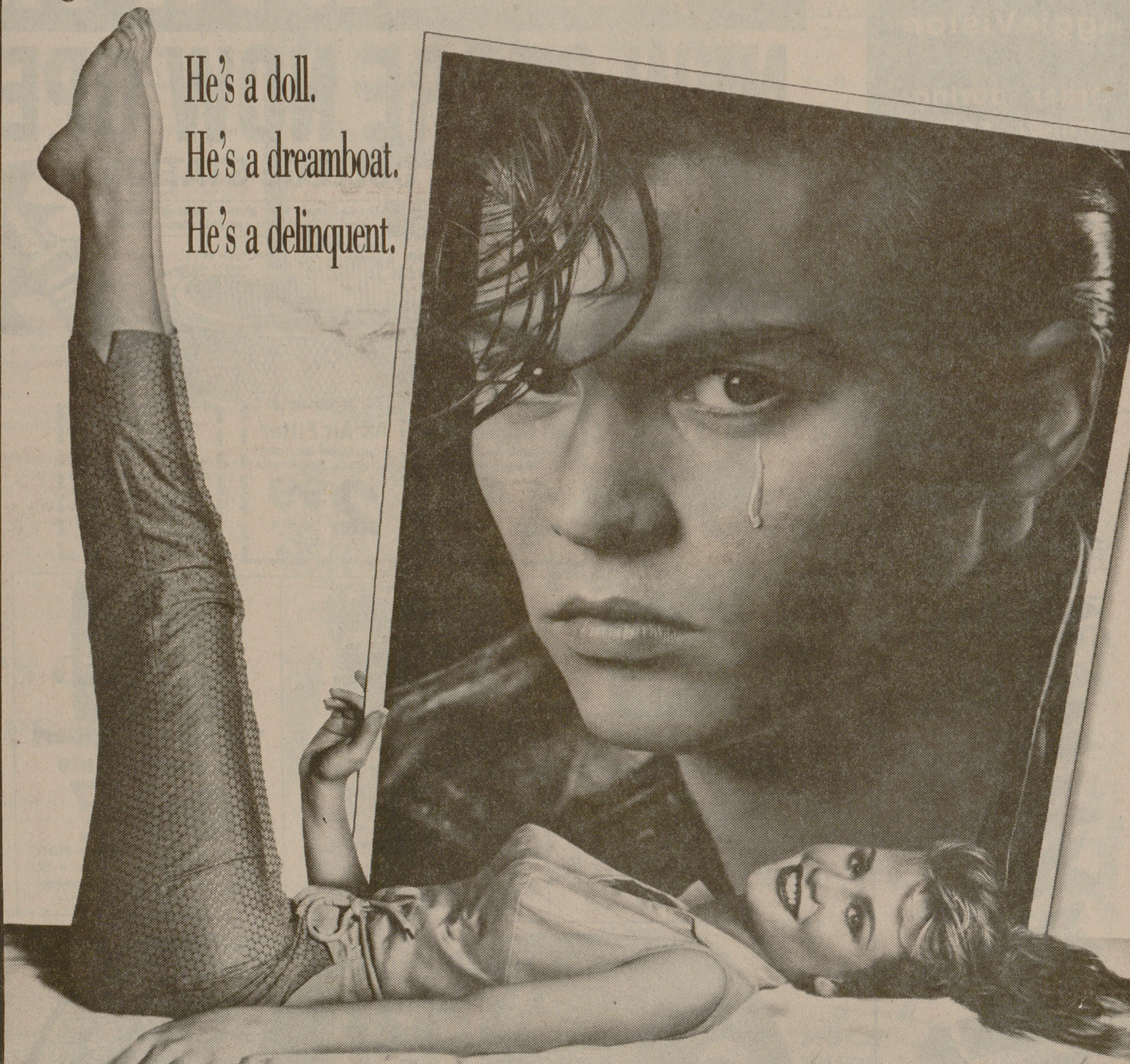




