ingitis (inflammation of the membranes covering the brain and spinal cord), encephalitis, deafness and sterility in men. During the first three months of pregnancy, rubella can cause miscarriage or serious malformations in the fetus.
"Because of all the interaction, the

college environment facilitates the transmission of these diseases," Gonzalez-Lima said.

She said the diseases can be transmitted by casual contact such as sitting close to someone who has the disease, touching someone who has the disease or talking to someone who has the disease.

However, Gonzalez-Lima said, there is no need for students to panic about possibly contracting

measles, mumps or rubella.

"Students should worry up to the point of getting vaccinized," she said. "After vaccination there is no need to worry.'

"It's very important that students keep track of their own health records and get vaccinations when nec-

The health center offers a mea-sles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine for \$26 and a measles-only vaccine


