Judge keeps activists away from residence

Gynecologist's home picketed

CORPUS CHRISTI (AP) — Neighbors of a gynecologist whose home has been picketed by an anti-abortion group are hailing a judge's decision to halt the demonstrations within 100 yards of the doctor's residence.

Dr. Edward Aquino, who performs some abortions at his clinic, filed a suit Wednesday against anti-abortion leader Rex Moses and the Body of Christ Rescue.

Judge Robert Blackmon of the 117th District Court signed a temporary restraining order Wednesday prohibiting picketing within 100 yards of the Aquino home until an April 23 hearing on a temporary injunction.

It is the second time Aquino has taken anti-abortion protestors to court to stop picketing at his home. Aquino last year was granted a permanent injunction against South Texans for Life and was awarded \$810,000 in damages.

The injunction, which prohibited the group from picketing within 400 feet of the Aquino home, applies only to South Texans for Life. The case is under review by the 13th Court of Appeals.

Several neighbors have complained that the pickets violate their privacy and that they belong to Aquino's clinic, not at his home.

Moses said he planned to mail letters to about 20 of Aquino's neighbors to explain why he is picketing the home.

"The reason so many children have died is because we have forgotten them," Moses wrote in his letter. "My commitment is that they will be forgotten no longer. I am sorry for whatever impact that this may have had on you and your family."

But neighbor Juan Saenz said, "letter from Moses won't sway his belief that the picketers have no business in the neighborhood."

Moses has said he expected to be sued and that he and his fellow protestors are "judgment-proof" in that they lack sufficient assets to be taken as payment for damages.

The doctor, represented by attorney Tony Bonilla, is seeking an unspecified amount of actual and punitive damages.

The suit alleges that the picketing "has raised the level of fear and panic within the Aquino household to unbearable levels which is adversely affecting the health of the children and the well being of the family."

Moses and the others have picketed Aquino's home every day except Sunday since the demonstrations started last Saturday, Aquino said. He said there have been more than 12 demonstrators each time.

Moses told the Corpus Christi Caller-Times on Wednesday that he did not intend to harm the doctor's wife, Mercedes, or her children. He said he wants to make sure that no one forgets the children who have aborted.
