UT paper's coverage sparks feud

AUSTIN (AP) — Controversy over gay rights coverage in the student newspaper has renewed friction between some University of Texas students and the administration.

The Daily Texans' reporting of a gay and lesbian rally this week sparked outrage among some professors and students, but the paper's editor said Saturday he stands by the paper's treatment of the event.

The front-page story contained explicit language describing homosexual sex and was accompanied by a photograph showing gay and lesbian couples kissing.

"Some of the things that we report on are going to be shocking, but if it's newsworthy we are going to report on it," Kevin McHargue, editor of the 50,000-circulation paper, said.

Gale Wiley, who teaches journalism at UT, said the paper's coverage was sensationalistic and self-serving.

"What we have is a group of kids trying to call attention to themselves," he said.

Other students opposed the Texan's report and photograph. "What is next?" wrote Ivan Salazar, a physics major, in a letter to the editor printed in the Daily Texan. "Pictures of child molestation and sex with animals in The Daily Pravda?"

The story was followed the next day with a front-page correction in which the paper further clarified a rally speaker's preference for homosexual sex. The issue also contained a letter to the editor from the speaker, who had complained he was misquoted because the Daily Texan had paraphrased him. The letter contained his exact quotes, which were more explicit.


McHargue said it is the Texan's policy to run corrections of front-page stories on the front page. "The quotes were wrong and we had to correct the quotes," he said.

Martin "Red" Gibson, a journalism professor, said he fears the Texan was used by an outspoken minority.

"There is always a danger when someone starts using the press for their own purposes — left-wing, right-wing, straight or gay," Gibson told the Austin American-Statesman.

Gibson serves on a board that oversees the paper's business operations but has no control over content. The Texan makes 95 percent of its \$2.2 million budget from advertising and 5 percent, or \$150,000, from student fees.


