# Heat turned up in **Texas** politics

AUSTIN (AP) — The state attorney general's race heated up Wednesday as Republican J.E. "Buster" Brown criticized his opponent, Democrat Dan Morales, for being endorsed by gays and lesbians. Morales said Brown has started a campaign based on hate.

In accepting an endorsement by the National Rifle Association, Brown pointed out that Morales has been endorsed by the Lesbian-Gay Political Caucus and the Texas AFL-CIO

"Mainstream conservative groups are backing me, and far-out fringe liberal groups are supporting Mo-rales," said Brown, a state senator from Lake Jackson. "That alone tells voters a lot about this race."

Morales, a state representative from San Antonio, responded, "I think Texans understand a hate campaign for what it is. I will continue to talk about the issues.

Brown's statement concerning gays and lesbians is in step with some other GOP candidates. Republican gubernatorial nominee Clayton Williams has blasted Democrat Ann Richards for her endorsement by the Lesbian-Gay Caucus, and the state Republican Party convention was noted for its anti-gay rhetoric. ## V.P. informs children of crisis Quayle stresses defense, praises Bush's actions

DALLAS (AP) - The Iraqi president came like a thief in the night to mastermind the invasion oil-rich Kuwait last month, Vice President Dan Quayle said Wednesday

Saddam Hussein is like a burglar," Quayle told 485 elementary students at a North Dallas area school, "He is a person just like a burglar who comes into a house. But this time, he stays in the house

What President Bush and the rest of the world are trying to do is to get him out," he said of Operation Desert Shield.

Quayle made the comments at Merriman Park Elementary School. He was accompanied by Republican gubernatorial candi-date Clayton Williams in the last day of the vice president's cam-paign swing for Texas GOP can-didates.

A tour of Johnson Space Center in Houston and more remarks were planned before Quayle's scheduled departure for Wash-ington Wednesday afternoon.



**Houston company** sells offshore rigs

HOUSTON (AP) — Zapata Corp. said Wednesday it has signed a de-finitive agreement to sell its offshore drilling rig float to P drilling rig fleet to Bermuda-based Arethusa Ltd. for \$298 million.

Aretnusa Ltd. for \$298 million. The Houston-based corporation will own 8.75 percent of the new company and will continue to man-age the 12 rigs, Zapata officials said. "The rig sale agreement is a major milestone in Zapata's comprehensive restructuring," said R.C. Lassiter, Zapata's chairman and chief exec-utive officer. "The cash from the rig utive officer. "The cash from the rig sale is the catalyst for the bank agreement which was announced about two weeks ago. The company can now focus its attention on a tender offer for its outstanding subor-dinated debentures and on obtaining necessary stockholder approval.

Company officials announced Aug. 23 Zapata had reached an agreement with bankers to restructure \$560 million of senior secured debt. The cash tender offer for the company's publicly held 101/4 per-cent subordinated debentures due 1997 and 10<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub> percent subordinated debentures due 2001 will be the final step in the restructuring. The offer is for \$480, including

accrued but unpaid interest, for each \$1,000 debenture which is ten-dered. The tender offer is expected to begin in early October when the
