Firm seeks buyout data

DALLAS (AP) — An investment banking firm interested in buying the financially troubled Greyhound Lines is courting the company's creditors, asking for release of private financial information, a spokesman said Monday.


Richard Ravitch, a partner of the New York-based Blackstone Group, said the firm is contacting Greyhound's creditors "one at a time," to ask their help in obtaining information needed for a buyout offer.

"We don't have access to the data— confidential information about the company— and we won't have unless the creditor can ask the company to (release it)," Ravitch
