"He is one of the best defensive backs in the country," Dykes said.
"And he is a giving player. Whatever is best for the team is best for

Dykes said he was turned on to Walker while recruiting two of Walker's teammates at McKin-

"When I saw that kid play, I knew he was something special," he said. "I think most people have some kind of a handicap and for some strange reason they make up for it in other areas. Sammy just gives you everything he's

got."
Walker, whose twin sister on Tech's Tammy is a starter on Tech's women's basketball team, is one of the fastest college players in the country. He finished with the ninth best time in the 100-meter sprint (10.31) in last year's NCAA Track and Field Championships.
