students thought one was needed. Missy Leyendecker, a mother and senior at A&M, says most people don't realize how much time it takes to get a child to a babysitter and make it to class on time. "I have to leave for class 40 minutes earlier than most students do," she says. "In those 40 minutes, I drive my son to sitter and say goodbye to him. Then, I drive to A&M and hunt for a parking spot so I can get to class on time. It's very time consuming."

Leyendecker says A&M desperately needs a day-care facility on its campus so students can spend less time commuting to and from babysitters' homes.

Cara Clark, says she and her husband have arranged their schedules around their son so they don't have to take him to day care.

Clark, who works part-time at her husband attends graduate school, says she seriously would consider using a campus day-care facility if one was to open. "It would make things easier for us," she says. Valerie Jochen, a graduate student, says two A&M committees, researching child care. "The Texas A&M/Bryan-College Station Child Care Providers Council has representatives from both University and the community working on the day-care issue," she says. "The other committee is a group of A&M students that are working independently on the issue." Jochen says although she doesn't think A&M will open a day-care facility in the next year, the idea is being considered.

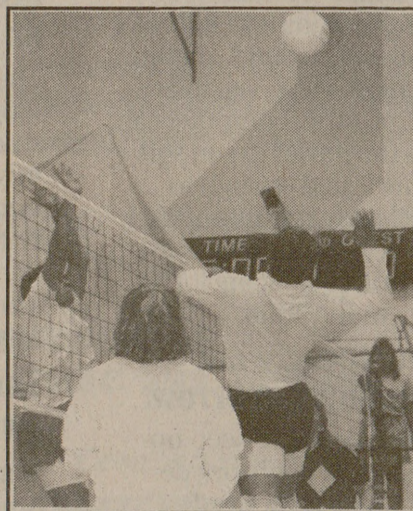

## TAMU OUTDOORS

Registration for the following events are now being taken in the Recreational Sports Office in 159 Read Building. Participants must pay for the trip at the time they register. For more information about TAMU Outdoors trips, call Patsy Kott at 845-7826.

**Mountain Biking:** Today is the last day to register for a TAMU Outdoors Mountain Biking trip on the tree-shaded Greenbelt Trail located at Barton Creek in Austin. There is an \$8.00 fee, and you must provide your own mountain bike\* and helmet. The trip is scheduled for Sunday, October 7 and is limited to 8 participants so hurry up and sign up today. \*Bikes are available for rental in Austin.

**Rock Climbing:** Registration begins today for an introduction to the thrills of rock climbing. Experienced guides will teach a variety of climbing techniques and safety systems. The \$42 (\$48 for non A&M) fee for this adventure includes transportation, rental of group camping equipment, climbing equipment, camping permits and experienced instruction. Beginners and intermediates welcome, but the trip is limited to 10 participants and registration lasts until October 8.

**Cozumel in December:** Join TAMU Outdoors on an end of the semester trip to Cozumel. The trip includes airfare, 5 days/4 nights lodging, Mexican hotel tax. The Dive package includes three two-tank boat dives, night dives, unlimited beach diving, tanks and weight belts. Cost for the trip is \$420 for A&M and \$445 for non-A&M. The Dive package costs \$520 for A&M and \$545 for non A&M. Register soon, for registration ends October 31 and the trip is limited to 8 participants.

**Downhill Skiing in January:** Back country ski the powder of the St. Paul, which is located in the San Juan Mountains between Silverton and Ouray, Colorado. The St. Paul is a comfortable inn complete with kerosene lamps, woodburning stove and sauna. All you need to bring is yourself and a few personal items. For \$405 (\$445 for non-A&M), this adventure includes transportation, lodging, food, all equipment, instruction and guides. The trip is limited to 13 participants and is scheduled for January 5-12. Registration has already begun and lasts until November 1.
