### Lawyers contest Keating's bail

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The \$5 million bail for Charles H. Keating Jr., a central figure in the nation's S&L crisis, should be reduced because he is broke and won't flee criminal charges, his attorneys argued Thursday.

A parade of character witnesses sought to persuade a judge to reduce bail for Keating and his three co-defendants, held on \$1 million bail each. Keating is former chairman of American Continental Corp.

The Arizona developer is \$4.5 million in debt and has only \$355 in his checking account, his personal accountant, Marilyn Marszowski, testified. Prosecutors cast doubt on her knowledge of his finances.

The hearing was scheduled to resume Friday after recessing without a ruling from Superior Court Judge Gary Klausner.

If bail is posted, the defendants must prove the money did not come from criminal activity before they could be released from jail.

### Iraq detains remaining Americans

WASHINGTON (AP) — At least 900 American men, women and children are trapped in Iraq and Kuwait, the State Department said today as it again accused Saddam Hussein's government of barbarism.

At least 93 of these U.S. hostages, including many with serious medical problems, have been detained by the Iraqi government. Nine were seized over the weekend, one as he tried to board what could be the last evacuation flight sanctioned by Baghdad.

Most of the adult male Americans in Iraq and Kuwait are in hiding, said Margaret D. Tutwiler, the State Department spokeswoman. For the sake of their safety she declined to provide exact figures.

More than 1,900 American citizens and their foreign-born family members have been evacuated from the two Persian Gulf countries since Iraq seized Kuwait Aug. 2.

### Crude prices continue rise, break records

NEW YORK (AP) — Oil prices jumped to near \$40 per barrel on the futures market Monday, about double the price before Iraq invaded Kuwait and close to the level of cash prices paid 10 years ago during the Iranian revolution.

Wholesale unleaded gasoline and home heating oil shot over \$1 per gallon as the market responded to amplified fears about the Persian Gulf crisis.

"If war breaks out and affects Saudi Arabia, prices could go much higher," said Philip L. Dodge, an analyst with Nomura Securities International Inc. "That seems to be the expectation now."

After peaking at \$39.20 per barrel in the afternoon, light sweet crude for November delivery settled up \$2.82 at \$38.25 per barrel — a new record on the New York Mercantile Exchange, where oil futures have been traded since 1983.

Crude opened the day at \$37.20, surpassing a record set Friday, then quickly rose above the \$38 mark, where it stayed for the rest of the trading session.

The sharp rise had speculators guessing that oil futures might soon hit the \$40 mark, matching the cash price paid in 1980.

Trader Ed Kevelson at Dean Witter Reynolds Inc. said the new highs were coming in fairly light volume as Monday's rapid rise scared off some investors.

The surge was attributed to speculation from Iraqi President Saddam Hussein, who indicated he might launch an all-out war, possibly by attacking Saudi oil fields, rather than allow the U.N. trade embargo to "strangle" Iraq. Recent estimates have put the price of oil at \$60 per barrel if a shooting war breaks out.

Meanwhile, stock prices were broadly lower Monday in response to the Gulf and other factors affecting the economy, especially the precarious position of the national banks. The Dow Jones industrial average was down 59.41 at 2,452.97.

Oil's dramatic rise helped jack up the price of refined petroleum products, which had been moving steadily higher recently on fears of supply shortages.

Home heating oil was up 6.7 cents to \$1.039 per gallon for October delivery. Unleaded gasoline rose 6.78 cents to \$1.042 per gallon for October contracts.

Gasoline futures last traded above \$1 on Aug. 24, while heating oil futures had not been that high since the price spike last December.

Natural gas also rose sharply Monday, with November contracts up 6.4 cents to \$1.936 per 100 cubic feet.

Analysts said \$40 oil could push up inflation, while prompting bigger increases for gasoline prices at the pump.

The nationwide Lundberg Survey of 18,500 gas stations found that the average price of a gallon of gasoline at the pump has hit an all-time high of slightly more than \$1.38, slightly higher than a previous record of just under \$1.38, set in March 1981.
