AUSTIN (AP) — For the second time, Travis County Deputy Sheriff David Davis' life appears to have been saved by a bulletproof vest.

Davis, who turns 40 on Thursday, was shot Tuesday by a man he never saw as he tried to stop a would-be burglar outside the office of Cablevision of Lake Travis just west of Austin, authorities said.

Davis, who has been with the sheriffs office for five years, was treated for a bruised chest at Brackenridge Hospital and released. Had he not been wearing the vest, "It would have more than likely been fatal,"

Officers said Davis was on routine patrol during the most recent inci-dent. He stopped at the cable TV office and noticed a man inside a fenced area. Davis told the man to stop, but he started to run. Investigator Gary Cutler said Davis then was shot by someone else who had been hiding in the bushes.

Bailey said all 68 sheriff's officers in the uniform patrol division are issued vests, but they aren't required to wear them.

"They're encouraged to wear them all the time, and most of the officers do," Bailey said.

HURST (AP) — Charges are pending against a for-mer Boy Scout troop adviser who was arrested after two boys complained that he fondled them, police say.

The man, a 65-year-old Explorer adviser for more than 30 years, was arrested Tuesday by Hurst police following a 10-day investigation.

The investigation began after two former troop members told police they were fondled after troop meetings at the man's home.


The district attorney's office has not filed charges but olice expect charges of indecency with a child to be filed against the man.

The man posted bond Tuesday and was released from jail, police said.

Hurst Police Sgt. Richard Winstanley said the boys also told police they were assaulted during an outing to a national park in Montague County about two years ago. Both are 17 now, he said.

Officers confiscated numerous videotapes and home movies from the man's residence. Some show troop members at camping and field trips, and others depict nude youngsters and "acts of exhibition," Winstanley said

The troop adviser was suspended from his membership with the national organization about four weeks ago when some residents voiced concern about his conduct, Boy Scout officials said.
