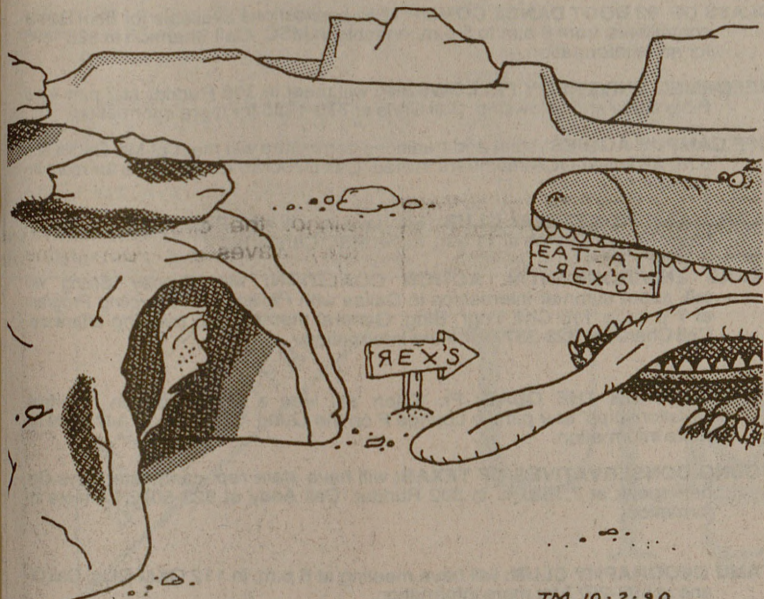

Atheist leader loses appeal

AUSTIN (AP) — Atheist leader Madalyn Murray O'Hair said she will call on all atheists to stop reporting for jury duty, after losing a U.S. Supreme Court appeal Monday challenging a jury oath that mentions God.

"This simply means that nobody need ever report for jury duty again," said O'Hair, best-known for her successful lawsuit against prayer in public schools.

"Why should they report?" asked O'Hair. "They have no constitutional right to sit on a jury. If nobody has a constitutional right to sit on a jury, how does anybody have a constitutional right to a trial by jury?"

O'Hair said she has been called for jury duty in November. She said she will not report but is likely to show up in court anyway.

"I think I will probably appeal to everybody sitting there to get up and walk out," she said.

The oath for potential jurors in Travis County contains the phrase "So help me God."

TRC nixes oil production increase

AUSTIN (AP) — The Texas Railroad Commission voted 2-1 Monday against raising oil production in the East Texas Field, with one commissioner saying the extra oil isn't needed despite the Persian Gulf crisis.

"There is no shortage of oil on the market any more ... The only thing hiking the price of oil is the New York Mercantile Exchange, based on rumor," Commissioner John Sharp said.

Sharp and Commissioner Jim Nugent outvoted Chairman Kent Hance, keeping the East Texas Field production at 86 percent. The proposed increase would have allowed production of an extra 8,000 to 15,000 barrels a day of oil.
